storm, and your destruction comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you. 'Then they will call on me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but they will not find me. Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD, they would have none of my counsel *and* despised my every rebuke. Therefore they shall eat the fruit of their own way, and be filled to the full with their own fancies. For the turning away of the simple will slay them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them; but whoever listens to me will dwell safely, and will be secure, without fear of evil'" (Proverbs 1:22-33).

When wicked Ahab was confronted by the prophet Elijah, the king blamed God's messenger for Israel's woes. "Is that you, O troubler of Israel" (1 Kings:18:17)? Ahab refused to look at himself and brought judgment on himself. Any who warn about sin, deceit, unbelief, and immorality (homosexual behavior, gender hypocrisy, distortion of marriage, and abortion are popular expressions today of anti-Christian behavior) are accused of hatred and hate crimes.

To those who recognize that all sin is an affront to the holy God before whom all must stand one day, words such as found in Proverbs are, for all their honesty, words of love spoken that all who *listen* may be free from fear of evil. To those who are gods to themselves and deaf to God, and who choose to do what is right in their own eyes, the words of the Lord are hateful, and the messengers are haters.

Speaking the whole counsel of God is not hate speech. We will not let who we are or what we preach be dictated by the godless God-deniers whose life is dictated by doing what is right in their own eyes. Their "end is the way of death" (Proverbs 16:25). Rather we will "follow His steps, Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth, Who when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously ... (1 Peter 2:21-23).

To preach and practice the truth is hate only to such as love the darkness and who have no respect for the Lord. Only as the heart is convicted and relief found in Christ can the disciplinary love of God as well as the love of God unto salvation in Christ be understood. "Who is wise? Let him understand these things. Who is prudent? Let him know them. For the ways of the LORD are right; The righteous walk in them, but transgressors stumble in them" (Hosea 14:9).

"Now, Lord, look on their threats and grant to Your servants that with all boldness they may speak Your Word" (Acts 4:29).

IS IT HATE OR LOVE?

In an age no different than any other in this sin-cursed world, except perhaps for more-in-your-face wickedness, we can hardly believe what we hear, nor believe what we see. Opinions, expressions of personal pique, political chicanery, and propaganda from the halls of congress to the newsroom are the norm. Even pictures can be photo-shopped. Everything must be taken with a grain of salt.

In Judges 17:6 and again in chapter 21:25 we read, "In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes." Today we have "kings," civil authorities. Nothing has changed. The distinction between truth and error, faith and unbelief, right and wrong, morality and immorality, principle and fancy, is blurred and gives license for sinner to do what is right in his own eyes. The result in our nation today is the undermining of, if not the destruction of, civility, decency, trust, and camaraderie. Another result is the fomenting of venomous hatred. The cause is clear. It is not a "which came first" debate, e.g. the horse or the cart. Scripture leaves no doubt. "The imagination [intent] of man's heart is evil from his youth" (Genesis 8:21). As God witnessed the wickedness of man before the flood, He recognized also that "every intent of the thoughts of his [man's] heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). This was not the man (human being) God created but was and is the result of the abuse of free will on the part of Eve and then Adam in the Garden when they disobeyed God. Man has destroyed himself and fouled his own nest. As he continues down this course of impenitence, he is inviting judgment in time and eternity.

There is of course a way out of the sin dilemma that afflicts society and threatens divine judgment in time and for eternity. The way out from slavery to sin and ultimate judgment is found in the grace and mercy of the Father Who in love overcame both in Christ. The Father's call to repentance goes out with the assurance that "The blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin." We have the assurance further, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:7,9). However, verses 8 and 10 of this same chapter sound a caveat not to be overlooked: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us ... If we say that we have not sinned we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us."

But right here lies a problem ... not with the Lord God; not with His Word. The call to repentance as well as the message of relief and ultimate salvation is muted, changed, and traded away by an apostate church which to a great extent has lost its own way, and the sense of its assigned mission.

What Martin Chemnitz (1522-1586) said of his time in connection with the description in Judges is still true today, "Scripture is constantly describing the corrupt and dissolute state of the church ..." In our apostate age, if those charged with sounding the call to repentance do not because they will not or cannot, the voices against social injustice, incivility, dishonesty, hypocrisy, relativism, and unbelief are muted. Even worse is it when driven by societal whims and hiding behind the cloak of love, those charged with proclaiming the way of righteousness defined in Scripture satisfy itching ears by countenancing unrighteousness and sinful practices. "Thus saith the Lord" is replaced by "We preach, practice, and tolerate what makes you feel good."

It is to be fully expected that what is said above will be mocked and ridiculed by many. Today's mentality may even call it hateful and judgmental, but is it love or hate to tell the truth? Of course, how one answers depends to a great extent on one's point of reference: Scripture or human reason.

While sin and every manner of evil will be in the world until the end of time, it is only the Lord through His Word Who can curb the course outbreak of sin that threatens society. Only the gospel can incline hearts to the way of righteousness. Only the Father's grace of forgiveness in Christ can change hearts and move people to walk in the way of the Lord rather than in their own.

Though not exclusively, to a great degree unbelief and societal definition of life is rooted in evolutionist philosophy so prevalent in natural religion and in public education. To the evolutionist there is no God to whom he believes himself accountable ... until judgment day when it will be too late. If there is no God and consequently no absolute standard of decency, it is no reach to do selfishly what is right in one's own eyes. So, "Do your own thing." At the same time under that false philosophy there is no God to whom to turn in time of stress, and ultimately at death. As a dying atheist said when told to hang on, "I am trying to, but what is there to hang on to?"

Our Savior Jesus Christ did not look out for His own interests, but for the interest of sinners, not that they (we) should continue in their (our) sin, but that they (we) should recognize their (our) sin and repent.

There is a reason why the Father said, "You shall ... You shall not" (Ten Commandments). He Who gave absolutes of right and wrong said also "By the Law is the knowledge of sin" (Romans 3:20). The apostle Paul wrote, "I would not have known sin except through the law" (Romans 7:7). The Father said "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23). This should surprise no one for He told Adam and Eve in Eden that the consequence of

disobedience would be death (Genesis 2:16-17). They ate and they died. Even though God made man ..., even though He implanted in his heart the natural law ..., even though He forewarned Adam and Eve of the consequence of disobedience ..., even though He gave the Law on Sinai ... does all this mean that God, then, hates man? Absolutely not!

Certainly, the message of the law is uncomfortable. It hurts. It is meant to. Do loving parents discipline and correct their children because they hate them? Does God bind us to His moral law because He hates us? The answer of those who reject Him is "yes;" of those who believe in Him the answer is "no." Unless there is recognition of sin and its dread eternal consequence, they who choose to do what is right in their own eyes have no reason to rue sin. God did not give His law in a spirit of hate, but in love. The Law of God serves its purpose when the sinner in despair cries out, "I have sinned." He Who does not desire the death of the wicked mends the heart of the penitent sinner at the foot of the cross of Christ.

All who recognize and confess their sin, and believe in the Savior from sin have reason to be thankful that the Spirit of God convicted them through the law, and thereafter has given the assurance: "The blood of Jesus Christ His [God's] Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). The penitent appreciates with thankful heart that the "gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23b). To all to whom God is the hope for time and eternity, this is love. To those who reject Him, the Father's message is foolishness.

We pray for faith to live honestly and without hypocrisy. Confronted with the reality of our own flesh, we pray daily for forgiveness in Christ. Christians bound by the Word of God will pray for faith to witness to the truth without ad hominem (personal) attacks, or from a spirit of obnoxious phariseeism. Therefore, we will be careful about how we speak, but speak we must, individually and as members of the Body of Christ. When we testify against the errors of an apostate church or the moral degeneration of society and a nation, as we speak His Word we speak by the authority of God. By those who love the darkness, we will be accused of hatred, of hate speech, and of being judgmental. Get used to it! They also falsely accused and hated Christ.

To speak the truth about the immorality which Scripture condemns and warn of the consequences is not hatred. God says, "How long, you simple ones, will you love simplicity? For scorners delight in their scorning, and fools hate knowledge. Turn at my rebuke; surely I will pour out my spirit on you; I will make my words known to you. Because I have called and you refused, I have stretched out my hand and no one regarded, Because you disdained all my counsel, and would have none of my rebuke, I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your terror comes, when your terror comes like a
