Professor Call

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last Sunday I was informed that the CLC's Call Committee for Educational Institutions, having prayed for the Holy Spirit's guidance, extended to me the divine call to serve as Professor at our church body's synodical institution of Immanuel Lutheran High School, College, and Seminary in Eau Claire,



WI. This means I now need to prayerfully and thoughtfully consider where the Lord would best have me serve Him ... either here with my call to serve at Immanuel.

The particular areas of this teaching call are specified as the following:

The position would require the ability to teach in a variety of areas, which may include high school and college courses in religion, social sciences, and church history. To fill a current need on campus, this individual would need to be able to provide spiritual counsel and encouragement to students in the Word of God, understanding and addressing the particular challenges that students often face today, and someone who is seminary trained. The position would, Godwilling, commence with the 2020-21 academic year.

In addition to the teaching load, there is an expectation to fill administrative duties needed on campus, many which are ministerial in nature.

Considering a call to be a Pastor or Professor isn't like considering a regular job. In fact, the title Professor isn't like the world often views it. The call defines this role as being part of the divine teaching ministry of conveying the LORD's holy and refreshing Word to souls in need of it. The ministry is divine in that the message and power is of the Gospel, not of the person. It's about emphasizing the comfort and joy found in the Good News of Jesus Christ and Him crucified. It's sobering to know that any divine call is from God Himself as I am to teach and preach His

divine Word. As such, the outcome of the ministry of the Word is eternal rather than temporal. Therefore, the decision cannot be made as to where the called individual might like it better. There are two basic questions to consider:

- 1) What are the different ministerial needs of the two calling entities?
- 2) Where can the called individual best utilize his God-given talents and abilities to faithfully serve the LORD in His kingdom work?

As I prayerfully consider this call, I certainly welcome the input of any who are impacted by the final decision. What is more helpful to the called worker than telling him to stay or go, is conveying the reasons for staying or going. If you have such thoughts, please share them with me.

This call comes at a busy time in that we are now beginning the Advent season and preparing for the Christmas season. Regardless, our theme is still fitting: "See Christmas through a Child's Eyes." May we all have child-like faith in God's promises as we take God at His Word and humbly submit ourselves to His will in all things of life. Please keep this call in your prayers and thoughts as I seek to follow the Lord's will concerning this particular matter.

Ephesians 4:11-16 And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head-- Christ-- from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love.
