Catechism Evangelism



Baptism

What Is BaptIsm? BaptIsm Is not Just plain water. It is water used by God's command and connected with God's Word.

What Is that Word of God? Christ says in the last chapter of Matthew. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

If you're anything like me, when you think about "congregational evangelism," your mind conjures up images of yard signs advertising for summer VBS programs, church floats built for local parades, or gospel tracts handed out by going door-to-door. Many of our churches continue to be quite creative when it comes to devising new ways to spread the gospel message of salvation to our neighbors and communities. One tool that might not immediately leap into our minds is Baptism.

When we read the words of Jesus' *Great Commission* as recorded in the Gospel of Matthew, it's good to remember that Baptism is one of the most powerful evangelism tools that God has given us. As we confess in Luther's Small Catechism "*Baptism is not just plain water... Baptism works the forgiveness of sins, delivers from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe".* Baptism is not a merely symbolic confession of faith, it's one of the ways in which the Holy Spirit creates and sustains faith in the hearts of God's children. Baptism should always be at the forefront of our evangelism goals.

Just look at the evangelism efforts of the New Testament Christians. When Peter proclaimed Christ crucified on Pentecost, what followed? The baptism of 3000 men, women, and children (Acts 2:38-41). When Philip explained Jesus' fulfillment of Isaiah's Messianic prophecy to the Ethiopian eunuch, what followed? The man was baptized that same day (Acts 8:32-38). When Paul and his companions "spoke the word of the Lord" to the jailer at Philippi, what followed? The jailer and his entire family were baptized "at once" (Acts 16:30-34).

In our traditionally Christian country, perhaps we often assume that most people have already been baptized. Let us flee from this assumption! Instead, let us always be leading those people with whom we have contact toward the baptismal font of God's grace. In our church outreach efforts and in our personal evangelism efforts, let us always remember to emphasize the powerful tools of Baptism, being sure to provide proper instruction alongside this precious gift of water connected with God's Word.

Mark 16:16 "He who believes and is baptized will be saved." Grant this, Lord, to all. Amen.
