TWO UNDENIABLE TRUTHS

God said, "In the day you eat of it, you shall surely die" (Genesis 2:17). The devil said, "You will not surely die" (Genesis 3:4). Adam and Eve believed the lie. Since the first lie, because the natural heart is corrupt, devious, polluted, and fraudulent, it is often a challenge to distinguish between the truth and the lie. "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it" (Jeremiah 17:9)? The Lord is not speaking through the prophet of a desperately wicked person. He is speaking of the human heart. Hypocrisy is living a lie. *Telling* an untruth is a lie. *Shading* the truth is a lie. Proverbs 6 speaks of "six things," "yes seven," things "God hates." One is "a lying tongue" and another, "A false witness who speaks lies."

The Lord established the *principle*! "Therefore, putting away lying, 'let each one of you speak truth with his neighbor'" (Ephesians 4:25). In interaction and communication with our neighbor we are to speak the truth. But how then shall we understand some lies mentioned in Scripture? Living in an imperfect world in which the Lord also hates "hands that shed innocent blood," the midwives "feared God" and did not kill the newborn Moses as Pharaoh had commanded. In response to Pharaoh's question, "Why," they lied (Exodus 1:15-21). When men with evil intent sought the spies in the promised land, Rahab hid them on the roof. When she was asked to deliver them she told them they had fled (Joshua 3:5).

In neither case, did the women lie to commit some evil, or to save their own reputation, further themselves, or save their own hide which is the general purpose of telling a lie. They in fact put themselves at risk. They did so to save lives of endangered men threatened by evil men who meant them harm. In neither the case of the midwives or Rahab (both of whose untruths the Lord used to His people's benefit) did the Lord tell them to lie. They made a choice under the circumstances for the reasons they did. Their behavior does not overthrow the principle, nor is it a license or an excuse for lying.

In our own age a government may "lie" to protect operational information from the enemy, or to hide a military strategy from the foe. A family may tell a "lie" to hide a surprise party from another member of the family. In one case the lie is for the protection of the citizens for whom it is responsible; in the other it is a "fun" lie. Again, the exception does not disprove or overthrow the principle.

On the other hand, Abraham denied Sarah was his wife and misled Abimelech who had designs on her (Genesis 20:2). David lied to take Bathsheba as a wife. Jacob with Rebekah's help lied to his father to gain Esau's blessing (Genesis 27). David's conscience persecuted him. Jacob had to flee. Ananias and Sapphira lied to enhance their reputation and died. Time after time we see how lying misleads, causes misery, discomfort, and pain, or brings judgment.

"Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord..." (Proverbs 12:22). A lie is of the devil, the father of lies (John 8:44). "The Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain" (Exodus 20:7).

Truth, number 1: EVERYONE DIES.

Sin entered the world, and death by sin (Romans 5). "The day you eat of it you shall surely die" (Genesis 2:17). Adam disobeyed the Lord. Through Adam death came upon all. Sin manifested itself immediately when Adam lied. "... I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself" (Genesis 3:10). The Lord saw right through it. "The wages of sin is death ..." (Romans 6:23). What the Lord said would happen, happened. It is proven by human experience. The Lord says what He means and means what He says. *God does not lie.* In His Word He speaks to the greater pandemic, one however of which the world is ignorant, and/or will not acknowledge. It is the pandemic of sin. He who denies God and His truth does so at peril to his soul!

Medical science struggles to contain epidemics and pandemics and find cures. We pray they succeed. But ever since the fall into sin, people have been dying. Over the course of time there have been epidemics, pandemics, wars, murders, suicides, accidents of one kind or another. People expire simply of natural causes. Until the end of time there will be death because neither medical science nor governments have, or will ever have, the solution to the underlying pandemic of sin.

The Lord alone has the solution to consequence of the sin pandemic. Death — spiritual, physical, eternal -- is a consequence of sin rooted in unbelief. A plague is a call to all to repent. In as much as all sin of whatever magnitude is sin against the holy God, no one's sin is greater than another's. "Unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5). Believers suffer and die in a plague, as well as unbelievers. Eternal death, however, is the ultimate judgment upon all who deny God and reject Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and Savior from sin.

The corollary to the reality of death is that while we are on the earth there will be aches and pains, trials and physical afflictions, discomfort, and anguish, brought on by the myriads of physical diseases—themselves a consequence of sin. Even with the best of medical science that can alleviate pain and disease as well as temporarily prolong life (as God wills), **everyone is going to die**. That is the way it has been, that is the way it is, and that is the way it will be, until our Lord comes again. That is the truth. **God does not lie**. God has the solution and therein **lies the second undeniable truth**. Christ Jesus overcame the consequences of sin.

In His high priestly prayer Jesus said to the Father, "Your Word is truth" (John 17:17). Jesus said of Himself, "I am the way, the truth, and the life ..." (John 14:6). Jesus said, "Because I live, you will live also" (John 14:19). His Word is confirmed by His resurrection as well as His Ascension.

Truth number 2: AS MANY AS BELIEVE IN CHRIST JESUS SHALL LIVE.

In the excitement of youth thoughts of death are few and far between. The older we get the oftener we think of it, not morbidly, but as a realistic progression of life. We become more in tune with the reality of our mortality. As uncomfortable as that is, it serves a divine purpose as it reminds us of what is really important in life.

The Heavenly Father in His love and mercy graciously determined in His own heart to rescue man from the fate he brought on himself. The Father determined that He would restore life—a life far removed from anything that we can imagine in this life. "... The gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

Our Lord Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though He may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die" (John 11:25-26). This presents an interesting dichotomy. In this life as **to** *the flesh we are dead in sins*, *but as to our regenerate being*, born of the Spirit through the Gospel, *we are alive in Christ*.

The Lord reconciled us unto the Father by His life, His death, His resurrection. All this confirmed what He said of Himself as the Resurrection and the Life. "Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1). We were "buried with Him in baptism" and "were raised with Him through faith in the working of God Who raised Him from the dead" (Colossians 2:12). In Christ, the Father "has made [us] alive together with Him, having forgiven [us] all trespasses" (Colossians 2:12). Sin is the cause of death. But as all our sins have been forgiven in Christ, the penalty of death has been removed, and they who believe in Christ "shall never die" (John 11:26).

The Lord never promised us freedom from pain, sickness, or suffering in this present sorrowful existence. From a Christian perspective, the discomfort and anguish, the pain and uncertainty and the physical afflictions of the body, and threats of viruses serve a purpose when they remind us to direct our eyes heavenward. Turn your thoughts away from all the things of this earth – good or bad. Paul wrote, "If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth. For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God" (Colossians 3:1-3).

Think about that. Alive in Christ through faith, your eternal life is banked securely in heaven—Scripture calls it your inheritance—with Christ in God. Yes, in this season of Ascension think about it. Through tears of weeping eyes, through the noise of this raucous world, tune your ears and heart to the Savior Who said to His troubled disciples, "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were

not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am there you may be also" (John 14:1-3).

With repentant hearts and steadfast faith, in times of uncertainty and fear, pray:

While in this life of sin and death O Lord, forgive us all our sin. Grant us the faith by Gospel Word, Never to doubt our sins forgiv'n.

As Jesus lives we thank You, Lord, We are alive through faith in Him, And though our life on earth will pass, We will not die but live again.

Help us O Lord in every need, In sickness, sorrow, want, or care In midst of earth's vain hopes, and fears Oh, keep our hope in Christ alive.

As every promise of Your Word Is truth and ne'er can be denied In darkest moments and despair, Still present is Immanuel.

O Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, By faithful Word and Gospel true Inspire our faith that we may know The joy and peace of heav'nly bliss.

Believer in Christ, as surely as Your God is true, He hears your prayer. You have a living hope that will carry you through that which strikes fear into those who without Christ have no hope. The journey in time may be difficult, it may be aggravating, the future here uncertain. But in Christ, you can see the other side! "For whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Romans 10:13). "God is not a man, that He should lie ..." (Numbers 23:19).

Therefore the Christ-believer says with certainty: "I know Whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that day" (2 Timothy 1:12).

Through faith we know the speaker. We know He speaks truth!

CLC E-Devotion – May 1, 2020

John 11:25-26 (NKJV) I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die.

Resurrection Answers

Jesus says, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you" (John 16:23). Yet every Christian struggles with "unanswered" prayers and God's apparent silence. How do we reconcile Jesus' words with our common let-downs?

He offers a shocking reply: "Until now you have asked nothing in My name" (John 16:24). What does He mean I've asked nothing? All I do is ask! The key phrase here is "in My name." There's nothing wrong with Jesus' ears. The problem is our ears, our assumptions. Instead of praying in His name, we tend to pray in our names, with our priorities in mind.

Ponder well, then, the name and promises Jesus revealed to Martha: "I am the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25). Jesus didn't say, "I am the temporary and fleeting." Yet we often pray as if that's His name. What will make me happy in the moment? What will solve my problems on my terms? Now instead of later.

When you consider what Jesus truly gives, the forgiveness of sins and salvation, faith realizes Jesus' timetable is, yes, different than ours, but oh so much better: "He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25). In the eternal perspective, any wait is more than worth it!

Does God really answer every proper prayer? The older German Lutheran catechisms gave a clear answer: "Yes, but in His own manner and at His appointed time." And the ultimate manner, time, and place is the Final Day, when God will "raise up me and all the dead, And give unto me and all believers in Christ eternal life." There and then, every prayer will be answered in full.

In heaven, you'll weep no more. In the resurrection, your aches and pains wash away into a glorified body. And whatever it is He seems to refuse to answer you right now, you won't even remember. "Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full." In Jesus' name, in perspective of all He promises, you won't be disappointed.
