- Physical Distancing at Worship: Given the circumstances with COVID-19, there are a large variety of personal opinions regarding what sort of precautions should be taken. This variety exists among our members. For example, some elect to wear masks while others don't. We do not wish to disturb everyone about our differences of opinions or be judgmental about them. Instead, in Christian love we are to bear with one another over matters that are not doctrinal. Thus we need to be mindful of the various sensitivities that exist about these precautions. During our Council meeting this past Sunday, some concerns were expressed about doing our best to honor physical distancing while at worship. The pews are set up to be alternating, post-its on the pews that are to be used. Our ushers are being asked to be proactive in ushering people in so that distancing between household units can be better accomplished. Also, please remember to do your visiting outside before and after worship. Thank you for being mindful of your fellow Christians.
- ▶ Lord's Supper: Beginning next Sunday, July 5, the Lord's Supper will be served. There will be some adjustments to hopefully provide communicants a comfort level with doing this. Each table ushered forward will be smaller with household groups to space out from each other. Pastor will solely be serving this as he ensures sanitization. The wafers will be dropped into people's hands, so be sure to extend both of them together for him to be able to do this easily. Also, only individual cups will be served. Pastor will extend the cup as communicants are asked to grab the cup without touching pastor's hands. Private communion will still be served if communicants desire this.

Pebbles in Our Shoes

Imagine a beautiful, sunny day. Your plan is to hike a mountain trail. As you begin, you can't help but notice the beauty of the trees, the blue sky, the birds and animals scurrying about.

After walking for a while, you notice that there is a pebble in your shoe. Well, you don't want to bother sitting down and taking your shoe off, so you try to ignore it and enjoy your hike anyway. It may not take long for the pebble in your shoe to seem bigger than the entire mountain you're climbing!

Sometimes we focus our attention so much on the uncomfortable things in life, that we miss many of the wonderful things. Truly, the pebbles in our shoes can make us very angry. We can also think of things like stubbing our toe on the chair or getting a flat tire. Some people call these things bad luck.

Our text says "In everything give thanks." When you first read it, did you wonder about it? In EVERYTHING give thanks? When changing a flat tire or washing our skinned knee, it's not likely that we are going to feel particularly thankful. Yet the Lord does tell us that we can and should be thankful in everything.

Since that is what He wants, He is going to do everything necessary to make it possible. Start with the big things. "Everything" includes sending His beloved Son Jesus Christ to suffer and die on the cross for us. He punished Jesus for our sins, so that we need not be punished. So we could live forever.

But "everything" also includes all the little things in life. He knows us better than we know ourselves. He knows when to give us things that make life fun and cozy. He also knows when something uncomfortable is needed.

That is why we can thank God for everything, even for the pebbles in our shoes.

Meeting opened with prayer. April Council meetings read and approved. The Treasurer's reports for April and May read and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Completed instruction classes with Joseph Thomas. Motion passed to recommend to the voters to ratify his communicant membership.
- Completed instruction classes with Tom Graham. Motion passed to recommend to the voters to ratify his communicant membership.
- Instruction classes continue with Grant Wells.
- Talked with the Elders about resuming communion the first Sun. of July with Pastor being the only one administering. Tables would be by family and small groups to help with the recommended social distancing as we deal with COVID-19. Private communion is still available upon request.
- Pastor recommended having VBS with member children and possibly relatives of members. Dates to be the same as already scheduled in July. Motion passed to limit VBS to member families and their grandchildren.
- The CLC Convention has been rescheduled for June 24-27, 2021.
- The MN Delegate Conference will likely be rescheduled as well.
- The ILC Tour Choir may still be rescheduled. Prof. Reim is hopeful that the tour can still happen in some form.
- Mission Festival is scheduled for Sun., Oct. 11, 2020. The Elders plan to invite Pastor Mark Bernthal to serve as guest preacher.
- Pastor thought today's service went well as everyone gets accustomed to the new guidelines in place as we deal with COVID-19.

- School year finished via online learning.
- Preparations for the upcoming school year are ongoing. The anticipated enrollment is 24 students (12 in K-2nd grade, 12 in grades 3-8).

Board of Trustees Report

- Security cameras were discussed. Some work done in the past number of cameras, placement, access to video and for what period. Technology has improved and the expense might not be as great as when last discussed.

Other Business

- The City of Fridley is looking into new locations for election day voting in November and has contacted Grace about being a possible site. Concerns about how it would affect the school and liability from an insurance standpoint. Motion to have Pastor notify the City that we are willing to be a polling location; support; passed 5-4.
- Social distancing by members during service. Are we following the plan we have in place? Ushers will have to be more involved in implementing.
- Rick continues looking into an AED and has one that he'd like to consider purchasing. Unit cost is \$1180 and it has pads for both children and adults. He was given the go-ahead to purchase without a vote.
