Lord's Supper Plan for Today at Grace

Pastor has no longer been contagious for a couple of weeks now. In fact, now that he has recovered from the virus, he should have immunity, at least for the time being. There will be some adjustments to how the Lord's Supper is served, which are as follows:

- → Pastor will be the only one serving the Lord's Supper and will be using sanitizer after each table.
- → The ushers will invite smaller groups of communicants to come forward.
- → The communicants are to physically distance by household groups, both in line and at the altar.
- → After waiting in line, the communicants should remove their masks as they begin to walk up to the altar.
- → The ushers will offer sanitizer as each group comes forward.
- → The communicants are to line up at the altar rail instead of at the floor level.
- → If anyone needs Pastor to come to the floor level, please remain there and he will come to you.
- → Pastor will drop the wafers into people's hands on the first pass. Please be sure to extend both hands together so that he is able to do this easily.
- → Only individual cups will be served, which will be placed on the altar rail as needed. Please take a cup from the altar rail when invited by Pastor to drink, touching only the cup and not the rail.
- → Pastor will come with an individual cup to those who cannot come to the altar rail.
- → The cups are to be disposed in the container located in the front pews, as normal.
- → The communicants should put their masks back on as they return to their pews.
- → Some have expressed a desire to have the Lord's Supper after the worship service for various reasons. Perhaps those who cannot come to the altar rail may wish to do this instead. Pastor will be accommodating this for those who wish to do so. He asks that those who wish to do this will contact him ahead of time.
- → If anyone desires private communion during the week, please contact Pastor and he will certainly do this upon request.

<u>CLC President's Letter – August 1, 2020</u>

In Christ Jesus, whose word is eternal truth in a world of uncertainty, dear fellow messengers of hope:

No one has to be reminded that we live in volatile, dangerous times. COVID has emerged as an enemy common to people worldwide, and all the more so because no one knows exactly what we're dealing with or how to conquer it. Political infighting and civil unrest have turned neighborhoods into war zones.

But they are not the greatest enemies we face. Paul writes, "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God" (Eph. 6:12). Satan and his demonic forces are less visible but far more deadly than the symptoms of a virus or the economic impact of business closures.

Without doubt the devil has used these months to further his own agenda. Being isolated at home for weeks on end may have been necessary for various reasons, but it has taken a toll on the physical and spiritual wellbeing of many. The Lord created us to be connected with one another and with Him.

Sin spoiled that perfect relationship, but Jesus came to restore it. He joined Himself to us, so that He might reconcile the world to God by suffering the punishment we rightfully deserved. Loved by God in Christ, how can we not show that same love to others. Jesus told the disciples, "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (Jn. 13:34-35).

As brothers and sisters in Christ, we are not to think more highly of ourselves than we ought. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 2:3-5). We all have the desire to reflect that love to one another.

However, after being apart from one another and focusing on our own personal situations, Satan is going to work overtime to use pride, anger, and fear in his efforts to tear us away from Jesus and one another. Many of us and our congregations are wrestling with practical matters associated with conducting in-person services and meetings. There is the issue of masks and other precautions which need to be discussed. Decisions have to be made regarding social distancing in services and whether to hold fellowship activities such as potlucks, picnics, and youth outings. What will the new

normal look like for our Christian day schools? There are going to be differences of opinion as to what course should be followed going forward. For all of us, selfishness and pride can be a dangerous temptation. Sinful pride assumes the attitude, "I know I am right. Everyone else should see the situation as I do, and if they don't, they are wrong." Wounded pride can quickly morph into anger and grudges.

Certainly, where God's Word speaks, there is no question. But in all other matters, no one has all the answers. Christian love and humility listens and strives for harmony as we work together to carry out the Lord's commission. There are differences of opinion among congregation members. Different congregations come to different conclusions as to their practices. That does not mean one approach is better than another or that one is right and one wrong. Rather than pass judgment on the actions of others, let us instead pray for one another asking that the Spirit will give each of us and each of our sister congregations the wisdom for their particular circumstances.

But what happens if...? Fear is another weapon Satan has learned to use very effectively. We make mistakes. We can't see past the present moment. But our confidence has never been in ourselves. "But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, 'You are my God.' My times are in your hands" (Ps. 31:15). "Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea" (Ps. 46:2).

These past months have been difficult in many ways. More challenges lie ahead. Yet we are incredibly blessed! Nothing that has happened anywhere in the world has undermined our salvation. The new normal will have no effect on what Jesus has already accomplished for us. "He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification" (Rom. 4:25). "Neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 8:39).

We live in dangerous times, but we are not defenseless. Paul urges, "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes" (Eph. 6:10-11). Rather than let Satan lure us away from the Lord and drive a wedge of distrust between us, may we humbly go to the Lord, acknowledge our pride, anger, and fear, and then rejoice in His reassuring forgiveness and peace. May we immerse ourselves in His Word and celebrate the Lord's Supper with real hunger and thirst for that spiritual food which nourishes and sustains the soul. May we pray for one another, be patient, and encourage one another out of love for Him who first loved us.

ILC Building Fund Paid Off--and Then Some:

A substantial gift was recently given to the CLC, designated for the ILC Building Fund. This special gift completely paid off the entire Academic Center Fund balance, and provided approximately one million dollars for a future building project. CLC President Mike Eichstadt has appointed a Planning Committee to move this forward. Since every building project has to be approved by a convention, the Committee's mandate is to present a plan and cost estimate to the 2021 convention. The Committee is using the 2006 ILC Long-Range Planning Committee's 134 page report as its starting point. The committee members are Tom Beekman, Tim Noeldner, David Albrecht, Jeff Schierenbeck, and Mike Roehl with advisors as Steve Ludvigson, Dan Schierenbeck, and Ross Roehl.

In recent years some have wondered what the next ILC building project will be. An updated and expanded gym? A dedicated Chapel? The 2006 Planning Committee did some work in that area. Since the current gym's footprint could not accommodate the space requirements of the new gym, the 2006 Planning Committee recommendation was to build a new gym to the south of the Commons (in the area between the Commons, slab, and amphitheater) and to completely renovate the existing fieldhouse to house functions like morning chapel, mass choir and band practices, plays, musicals, CLC GPC and conventions, storage, etc. Look for more details to be announced in the future.

Whatever the current Planning Committee may recommend to the 2021 Convention, we recognize this as just one more example of how, "A man's heart plans his way, But the LORD directs his steps." (**Proverbs 16:9**). Thank the LORD for His bounty, and for the fruits of faith in our CLC members!
