# Sermon: Ephesians 4:7-16

General Fund – September offerings of \$64,078 vs disbursements of \$101,951 increased the negative balance by \$37,873 to \$70,079. Expenditures were right on budget for the 1st Quarter, so the negative balance was due to a shortfall of offerings, though still they were \$30,000 higher than last September. And still we count our blessings much more than just daily bread! And our Boards of Trustees, Regents, Missions, & Ed & Publications still count on the Lord for their major funding through our regular offerings to our CLC General Fund.

- **ILC Operations** ILC September revenue of \$122,060 vs disbursements of \$110,758, giving ILC operations a positive cash flow for the month.
- **ILC Building Projects** With the CLC indebtedness on the Academic Center & North Hall dorm upgrades paid in full, and early, we have not only saved several hundred thousand dollars in interest, but our budget is helped with monthly savings of \$8,000 which we had been paying on that loan's debt service! Thanks & glory to our gracious God, who loads us daily with His benefits!
- **CEF** September revenue was \$24,277 from congregations' CEF loan payments vs disbursements of \$8,794 in CEF debt service for several CEF Promissory Notes repaid to members, resulting in the current CEF positive balance of \$3.2M. The Trustees expect several loans that will need this!
- **MDF** September offerings of \$8,670 vs disbursements of \$12,533 (4th of 12 \$10,000 construction loan installments for the Nepal Bible Institute classroom, \$1,300 for foreign missions visitation & exploratory work, and the balance for administration expenses.
- **Kinship** September gifts of \$10,064 (\$6,304 congregation offerings, \$3,760 orphan & sem student sponsors) vs disbursements of \$16,200 (\$8,070 for foreign orphanage subsidy, and \$8,050 for foreign seminary students.

Regardless of our synodical, congregational, or personal financial position & circumstances, whether rich or poor, we have to confess with wealthy King David, "I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread." (Psalm 37:25)

### STAYING TRUE TO THE LORD'S COMMISSION

Our Lord Jesus Christ said, "If you abide in My Word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:31-32). A disciple is a student, a follower of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Living Word. Through faith in Christ, true God and true Man, believers are children of God the Father and possessors of

salvation. On the Mount of Ascension, Jesus gave His disciples through the ages the commission saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28: 18-20).



This commission was not given to the world, but to Christbelievers. The commission is to proclaim, as Paul described it, the whole counsel of God, chief of which is the law which condemns the sinner, and the gospel which is the message of justification and salvation by grace through faith in Christ; by divine authority, the Church through its ministry is authorized to preach the Word of God and to administer the Sacraments, and especially the authority to forgive sins and to retain sins. Paul wrote, "Woe is me if I do not preach the gospel" (1 Corinthians 9:16)!

The Lord reminds us through the prophet, "He who has My Word, let him speak My Word faithfully" (Jeremiah 23:28). Through the gospel faithfully proclaimed, the Spirit of God sanctifies and keeps the believer in the true faith. Through the gospel, the Spirit creates in the believer the sanctified will and power to live to the praise and glory of God. Through the gospel the Spirit converts hearts!

The primary mission of the Church concerns eternal salvation. The foundation of its ministry is the preaching of repentance and remission of sins in Jesus' name (Luke 24:47). In as much as the faithful church speaks to the whole person — body and soul, the church faithful to the Lord and to its call proclaims the Word through which believers are empowered to be responsible citizens in the nation and the world; when the church faithfully sets forth the will of God the common good of government and society is promoted.

In this fallen world, church and government have a complementary but different role. The ministry of the Christian Church is *heaven-focused*. On the other hand, the proper role of government in this context is to guarantee freedom and the right of all citizens to worship

and teach according to the dictates of their conscience. Government has nothing to do with heaven. The concerns of the state are temporal. The concerns of the Church are eternal. The state is ruled by law; the Church is ruled by the Gospel.



Consequently, politics as such have no

place in the ministry of the church called to proclaim salvation in Christ; politics does not belong in the pulpit. Unfortunately, today the message from many pulpits is becoming blurred. The world is entering the church and is even being invited in. In as much as the world and its political operatives do not know or have respect for the gospel the Church, the body of believers, suffers.

As society becomes blatantly more immoral if not amoral, and government and politicians either out of ignorance or fear approve that which Scripture calls immoral and sin, faithful ministers of the Word in the course of faithful preaching, by the very nature of their responsibility to the Lord, and out of concern for souls, will contradict those who in the name of rights, love, and political correctness defend what Scripture calls sin. Obedience to government as Scripture enjoins does not translate to silence when government, and political agendas or causes promote or advance sin. In this scenario faithful preaching of law and gospel frequently engenders accusations of discrimination, hatred, anti- (you name it), political agendas.

Individual Christians and the *faithful* Christian Church today are facing increasing pressure in an overtly anti-Christian society. Witness societal, legal, and governmental sanctions against any who in preaching or practical living disapprove of the sinful practice of homosexuality, transgenderism, societal abuse of marriage, abortion, the undermining of parental responsibility, all of which are contrary to the expressed will of God. Further, witness the charges of misogyny spewed at faithful Christian pastors who teach and Christians who believe what Scripture says of the husband/wife relationship.

Scripture teaches, and Christians believe that God's people in society are to abide by the laws of the land however mistaken, even immoral, some laws may be. They are not to take up arms or counsel rebellion against the government. But *Christians* whose consciences are bound by the Word of God *cannot remain silent*. They have the responsibility under God, and in the name of truth to speak and by legal means to try to change laws that support immorality and wickedness. If they cannot effect a change, and they are expected to participate in or actively promote what is demonstrably sinful, Scripture says say "No," for "we ought to obey God rather than man" (Acts 5:29). If necessary, Christians are called upon as an exercise of faith to suffer the consequences. Better to face the wrath of society and government in time, than to face the judgment of God in eternity!

In the face of anti-Christian influences and forces, Paul exhorts God's people to stand, clad in the armor of God. He wrote to the Ephesians, "Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which, you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints..." (Ephesians 6:14-18).

The instruction to the Church is, "Preach the Word, preach the Word, preach the Word," which is the sword of the Spirit that conquers hearts. We need not, and we dare not drag politics into the pulpit; neither can we compromise with the world or bow to its godless philosophies. As the Lord commissioned the Church to teach "all things that I have commanded you," as faithful representatives of our Lord we are to "be ready in season and out of season [to] convince rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching" (2 Timothy 4:2). The only law to be preached from our pulpits is the law of God which uncovers sin and convicts the sinner so that he will acknowledge his sin and confess it unto the Lord. With all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and shod with the gospel of peace, we will proclaim from our pulpits the saving gospel to the troubled, preach the peace of God through the forgiveness of sins, and proclaim the good news which converts the heart and is the power of God unto salvation in Christ Jesus." Woe is me if I do not preach the Gospel."

As we face down the foe, it behooves us to pray earnestly to the Lord of the Church to close the doors to our heart and to the church and thus forbid entrance to the world and Satan; we will pray to Him to guard and keep us from letting the foe dictate our ministry and purpose; we will pray for strength to keep up the fight, and for the heart to speak the truth in love. We will pray that as we have our inheritance safely reserved in heavens (1 Peter 1), our focus remains on heaven. Finally, we pray that the Lord will bless our gospel witness, so that those still caught in the snares and webs of Satan's deceit will be won for heaven.

O God, our God in heav'n above, Who knows the ways of men on earth, In love You sent Your only Son And saved us from the law's dread curse

Look down and keep all You've redeemed, Who by the Spirit call on You. Protect us from the evil foe Who daily plots our overthrow.

The Church exists by Your good grace, Please keep it in your warm embrace. Help it to stand in Word and truth, That all it says reflects Your will.

O Lord, our God, our Savior true, Help us to boldly share Your Word, That by Your grace some may be won, Who still are walking in death's way.
