

CLC E-Devotion – Ascension Day 2017

Luke 24:46-47, 51 Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem" ... Now it came to pass, while He blessed them, that He was parted from them and carried up into heaven.

REJOICE! JESUS HAS ASCENDED TO BE YOUR KING!

When He was on this earth, Christ fulfilled what we call His three offices, namely those of Prophet, Priest, and King. He fulfilled those offices on earth, but He did not abandon them when His redemptive work was done. He continues to carry out these offices in eternity in behalf of the Church.

When Christ came into the world He left His throne in heaven, but He did not abdicate that throne. Jesus told Pilate, "'My Kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now My kingdom is not from here.' Pilate therefore said to Him, 'Are you a king then?' Jesus answered, 'You say rightly that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice.'"

It is the responsibility of king to defend the citizens of his kingdom, and so Christ, "Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them triumphing over them in [the cross]" (Colossians 2:15). As our King, Christ conquered all of our spiritual enemies when He died upon the cross--all of them--sin, death, and the devil were overcome in one blow at Christ's death. We read in 1 John 3:8, "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil."

Having ascended into Heaven, "[God]...seated [Christ] at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power ... And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church..." (Colossians 1:20-22). Christ continues to carry out His office as King, not only ruling in the hearts of His people with His Word, but ruling over all things for His Church! Only the King of all Creation could make and *keep* this Promise: "... all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28).

So Paul wrote these reassuring words to the Citizens of God's Kingdom: "For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

India and Nepal Update:

Brothers,

Please keep India and Nepal in your prayers. Both countries are being devastated by covid-19. https://www.worldometers.info/coronavirus/

India

Fortunately the state of Andhra Pradesh, where most of our brothers and sisters are located, has not been as touched by this wave (more like a wall) of cases. Tamil Nadu state (where I used to live), has imposed a lockdown until May 24th. We have a number of churches in this state. Bengaluru in Karnataka has also been severely hit. We have about 60 pastors in that area.



The health care system in India has basically collapsed. You may have seen some of the news. Hospitals are running out of oxygen and people in intensive care are dying as a result. People are trying to find oxygen canisters themselves to bring to their loved ones in the hospital (if they have even been able to find a hospital with a bed available). Many hospitals are putting two patients to a bed. This is especially bad in the rural areas (where a majority of our churches are located).

Nepal

Nepal is experiencing an even worse crisis. They are currently number 3 in new case world-wide (behind India and Iran), and this is especially striking because their population is so much smaller! In the recent several days they have reported over 9,000 new cases each day in a country with a population of just under 30 million (India has 1.37 billion). Although it actually ranks 7th world-wide in cases by 1000.

As bad as the medical situation is in India, it is even worse in Nepal.

Liberia Update

This past week I had a few phone conversations with Pastor Joseph Kwiwalazu, our lead instructor in Liberia. Last month he attempted to venture to the remote area of Bopolu (BOE-poe-loo) in order to resume classes with pastors, evangelists, and Christian school teachers. This had to be put on hold due to local circumstances. Given all the other delays, I expected that this would be put on hold for a few more months.

But Pastor Kwiwalazu pleasantly surprised me early this week with a message that he had safely arrived at Bopolu. He was able to conduct doctrinal classes for much of the week with various interested contacts we have had there. On Friday this week, Pastor Kwiwalazu put his phone on speaker with the group there and myself. It was a true joy to listen to the group express their interest in what they were learning from the Word of God. They greatly appreciate the support they have received in having such instruction.

Also, a year ago the CLC Board of Missions extended a small token of help to all our brothers and sisters in the mission field. This group in Bopolu received a small amount at a trying time. They also expressed their surprise that we would think of them while we were also experiencing the pandemic. So they expressed gratitude for such an extension of Christian love. But overwhelmingly, the greatest appreciation they expressed was for gaining further insight into the Scriptures as they have been treasuring this as great spiritual wealth from the LORD.

As this group expands, Pastor Kwiwalazu informed me that we probably need to refer to this group as the Gbarpolu (they say "BAH-poe-loo") group since the folks are coming from different places in Gbarpolu County, the <u>county</u> that the <u>town</u> of Bopolu is in. It personally took me some time to understand the difference as many speak as if the two are interchangeable.

Pastor Kwiwalazu also informed me that other contacts are regularly reaching out to him, including someone in a county that we haven't done any work in. He believes we will be able to conduct a Bible seminar there next time I am able to travel to Liberia. We thank the LORD that our opportunities in Liberia are continuing to abound.

Also, Pastor Kwiwalazu's own congregation in Paynesville (near Monrovia) is looking forward to laying the foundation of its church. They anticipate this happening quite soon. May the LORD lead them as them move ahead.
