CLC E-Devotion – September 18, 2017

Matthew 28:18-20 And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

GO THEREFORE ...

Often times this part of the great commission is portrayed or thought of as an imperative, or as a command. I've seen Christian clip art trying to depict this passage with a drawing of Jesus standing in front of His disciples with an arm outstretched as if He was a commanding general ordering His disciples to GO! While Jesus does send us out into the world with this and other passages of Scripture, this is not the emphasis of these words in Matthew 28. Perhaps a better way to understand the words of Jesus when He says: "Go therefore." is more like this: "As you are going." You see, what Jesus has in mind for His ambassadors is that we simply proclaim the Good News as we make our way through life. That's not to say that we don't make specific plans to share the Gospel from time to time, but it also means that we share the Gospel even when we haven't made specific plans to do so. Or another way to look at is that we look for opportunities to speak the truth of God's word at all times.

This too provides great comfort and encouragement for us as we do the work of evangelism. You see, effectiveness of Gospel does not depend on my great plans or evangelism projects. The power is always in the Word of God. I know that I have been discouraged at times because I've failed to "create" an evangelism opportunity. But sometimes I wonder if God's Kingdom wouldn't be better served if we spent as much time simply telling others about Jesus as we do worrying about evangelism programs and opportunities. To paraphrase this in a question: Do we spend more time talking about how to spread the Gospel than the time spent actually proclaiming the Gospel?

So, perhaps a better way to think of the great commission is this: As you are going ... make disciples of all nations, wherever and whenever the Lord opens a door of opportunity to share the Good News. Amen!?

Report to the Coordinating Council September 22, 2021

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand." (Ephesians 6:10-13 – NKJV)

Look around. Murder and rioting, hatred and vitriol are the marks of our society, at times, even among "friends." Is there any doubt that we live in evil days? A war is being waged around us.

From one perspective, things have changed a lot in our lives in the past twenty years. What is the cause of these drastic changes? Our culture has drifted away from the truth. This hasn't happened overnight, but the speed at which it is taking place is increasing. The majority of our culture is no longer Christian and what's worse, the majority of those who call themselves Christian are either woefully unprepared for battle or are playing dead just wanting to survive.

But from another perspective, things haven't really changed at all. We live in evil days today, just as our parents lived in evil days fifty years ago. Paul was living in evil days too. It doesn't matter on what continent or in what era of history we live. The days are evil. We live in a fallen world which is hostile to Christ and to His church. A war is raging around us.

As those who live in evil days, Paul encourages us to prepare for the war that is being fought around us. "Be strong in the Lord" Paul says. "Put on the whole armor of God... that you may be able to withstand in the evil day."

As we fight in this war, we need to remember, first of all, that the Lord is our strength. He is more powerful than the "principalities," "powers," "rulers of darkness," and "spiritual hosts of wickedness" against which we are battling. Our confidence is in Him. It rests in the cross and the victory that He won there, once and for all, and for every sinner. Nothing can undo that victory! But the battle that Paul describes in these verses is the battle for individual souls as we await the return of our Savior. The Lord desires the salvation of all those whom He has redeemed by His blood and seeks to bring them into His kingdom through His Word of Truth.

That war is being fought all around us. The Lord has called us to arms and has given us what we need to fight in this battle for souls, blood-bought souls for which Christ paid dearly to deliver from sin and death. Thank God that we are counted worthy to be in His army! Be strong and courageous, as we join the ranks of Believers and go forth to war in the power of His might!

Soldiers of the Cross, arise, gird you with your armor bright.

Mighty are your enemies, hard the battle you must fight.

O'er a faithless, fallen world raise your banner in the sky; Let it float there wide unfurled; bear it onward, lift it high.

Be the banner still unfurled, still unsheathed the Spirit's Sword; Spread Your Word in all the world; let Your kingdom come, O Lord. (William W. How)
