# The Order of Thanksgiving Worship &

- P: We conduct this service of thanksgiving and praise in the name of God the Father who created and preserves us, God the Son who has redeemed us, and God the Holy Spirit who has called us and sanctified us.
- C: (spoken) "Amen."
- P: Dear friends in Christ, aware of God's providence and grace, let us come before Him to confess our sins and look to Him in repentance and faith for forgiveness:
- C: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against You in our thoughts, our desires, our words and our actions. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. Nor have we always given You the thanks and praise that is due Your holy name.
  - Have mercy on us, and for the sake of the Lord Jesus Christ forgive our wrongs. Help us to delight in Your will and to walk in Your ways, giving thanks in all circumstances through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given His only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore rejoice and give thanks! God for Jesus' sake has removed your transgressions from you as far as east is from west. You are His own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to His will.

ALL: (spoken) "Amen."

Confession of Faith: First Arcicle Explanation From Large Catechism

P: Someone might ask, 'What sort of person is God? What does He do? How can one praise or picture or describe Him in a way that will really let people know Him? What do you know about Him?'

ALL: You could say: 'First, my God is the Father who made heaven and earth. I take nothing and no one else as God except Him alone, for there simply is no one else who could have made heaven and earth.'

P: What do you mean by those words?

ALL: What I mean to say and what I believe is that I am a creation of God, that is, He gave me and continuously preserves for me my body, soul, and life, my bodily members great and small, all my senses, my reason and intellect, and so on, also food and drink, clothing, livelihood, wife and child, servants, house and home, and so on.

Besides this He causes the necessities and comforts of life to be provided for me by everything in creation – the sun, the moon, the stars in the sky, day and night,

air, fire, water, the earth and all that it can produce, birds, fish, animals, grains and all manner of produce.

He also gives whatever other physical and temporal blessings there may be, such as good government, peace, and security.

It follows self-evidently that, since everything that we possess as well as everything else in heaven and on earth is daily given, sustained, and preserved by God, therefore we in turn certainly owe it to Him to love, praise, and thank Him without ceasing and, in short, to serve Him wholly and completely, as He requires and enjoins us to do in the Ten Commandments.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>20</sup> When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no small tempest lay on us, all hope of our being saved was at last abandoned. <sup>21</sup> Since they had been without food for a long time, Paul stood up among them and said, "Men, you should have listened to me and not have set sail from Crete and incurred this injury and loss. <sup>22</sup> Yet now I urge you to take heart, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship. <sup>23</sup> For this very night there stood before me an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I worship, <sup>24</sup> and he said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul; you

## CLC E-Devotion - Tuesday, November 24, 2020

2 Corinthians 8:8-9 (NKJV) I speak not by commandment, but I am testing the sincerity of your love by the diligence of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich.

### **Thanks and Giving**

Paul is giving us some practical advice about thanksgiving, but notice how he starts. He begins with a disclaimer: he is not speaking by commandment. Even though he had the authority of an apostle called by Jesus Himself to preach and teach, he knows he can't tell us how much is enough.

Instead, he asks the Corinthians and us to consider some examples of free giving. The Christians in Macedonia had given an impressive offering of aid to the Christians in Jerusalem. The Corinthians were wealthier than the Macedonians, and they had pledged to give to Jerusalem too, but for some reason they neglected to finish the collection. Maybe they thought they could ease up, that the Macedonian offering had covered the need for the time being. Maybe some had the selfish thoughts that if they gave money to Jerusalem, they might come up short in meeting their own needs.

Either way, Paul points out, the thanksgiving was lacking in both thanks and giving. Did Jesus worry about whether each person would be able to pay Him back for His offering of His life? No- after all, we aren't talking about merely paying for life with life. To pay back what Jesus gave means to pay back the eternal God who emptied Himself to become man and live among us. It's simply not possible.

Our thanks and our giving is always sufficient when it is given willingly, generously, and in faith. And that means the only thing that can motivate us to give thanks is the Gospel of God's overflowing grace in Jesus Christ.
