Dear fellow witnesses of the Light:

First thing every morning on the way to the kitchen, I've taken a few moments to glance out the living room window at the neighbor's cheerful Christmas lights. They have been a bright spot in the predawn winter darkness. But I know what's going to happen. Before too long, I'll look out one morning and the neighbor's house will be dark. The lights will be gone. And it's not just lights, trees, and decorations. The company goes home. The joyful Christmas services are just memories archived on



YouTube, and what's left? Many of us, along with the fellow believers we serve, experience a letdown of some sort or another after Christmas.

So now is the perfect time for the Epiphany season! "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you" (Is. 60:1-2). The colorful strands of LEDs are turned off, but Jesus' light shines out into the darkness for all to see and enjoy. "In him was life, and that life was the light of men....The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world" (Jn. 1:4,9). Jesus says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (Jn. 8:12).

2022 is a new year, but the same old darkness of sin is as evident as ever. Wars and rumors of wars are rampant around the world. Sickness, suffering, and death are not far from anyone. Recognizing the Lord and humbly turning to Him in repentance is the last thing on many people's minds. The darkness is not only without, but within us too. We see it in the kingdom work we had always intended to accomplish last year, but didn't. It's painfully obvious in our personal record of laziness, pride, indifference to the needs of others, lack of enthusiasm for prayer and countless other sins for which God's Law convicts us. We are far from perfect. We have nothing to boast of in ourselves. Paul's admission is ours: "I'm the chief of sinners!"

But arise, shine! The Word became flesh. Christ the creator of light came to shine the light of forgiveness and eternal life into every dark corner. We don't have to drag our past sins into the new year. The Word became flesh so that His head could be crowned with thorns, His hands and feet pierced with nails, and His blood shed to cleanse us from all sin. "We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Rom. 5:1).

"We beheld His glory," John writes, "the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (Jn. 1:14). Can you imagine a life without seeing that glory? There would be nothing but utter darkness and total despair. Living in Christ's light, we never walk in darkness. "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and staff, they comfort me" (Ps. 23:4). Prof. Paul Sullivan was blessed with that confidence of faith. He lived in the light of Christ with the mindset of the apostle Paul who said, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Phil. 1:21). We thank the Lord for Prof. Sullivan's gifts and service to the CLC and to the Church at large. We praise the Savior for receiving His faithful servant safely home to eternal glory.

"Arise, shine, for your light has come!" In the new year ahead may we see the glory of Christ the Word in our daily devotion and study time, in the spiritual feast of His body and blood in the sacrament, in every class and worship service, and in the precious family fellowship of believers who love and care for one another.
