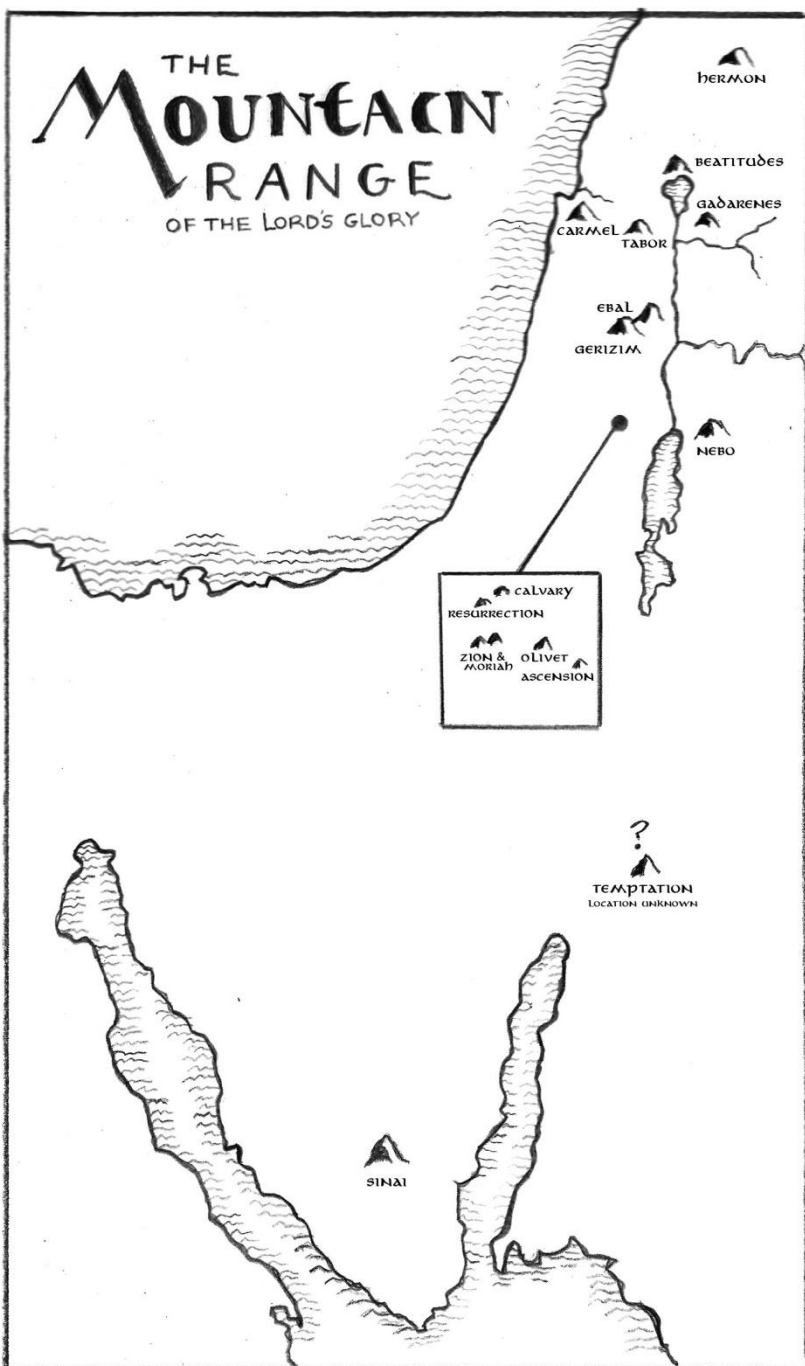

²⁸ When He had said this, He went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ And it came to pass, when He came near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mountain called Olivet, *that* He sent two of His disciples, ³⁰ saying, "Go into the village opposite *you*, where as you enter you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat. Loose it and bring *it here*." ³¹ "And if anyone asks you, 'Why are you loosing *it*?' thus you shall say to him, 'Because the Lord has need of *it*.'" ³² So those who were sent went their way and found *it* just as He had said to them. ³³ But as they were loosing the colt, the owners of it said to them, "Why are you loosing the colt?" ³⁴ And they said, "The Lord has need of him." ³⁵ Then they brought him to Jesus. And they threw their own clothes on the colt, and they set Jesus on him. ³⁶ And as He went, *many* spread their clothes on the road. ³⁷ Then, as He was now drawing near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works they had seen, ³⁸ saying: "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the LORD!" Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹ And some of the Pharisees called to Him from the crowd, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." ⁴⁰ But He answered and said to them, "I tell you that if these should keep silent, the stones would immediately cry out." 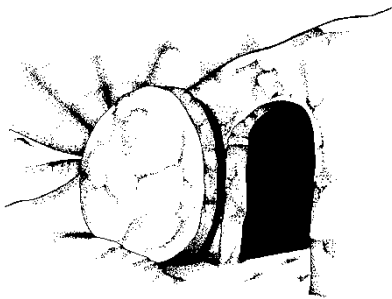

➔ **Organ Fund Update:** The LORD has certainly moved hearts to contribute to the new organ! This is a testament to how much Grace appreciates and values the opportunity to worship the LORD. The Council recently discussed how we are close to the Voters' target of \$55,000, short by about \$4,000. There could be some additional costs that could be covered by the fund for sanctuary preparations. While delivery of the instrument is unknown due to worldwide supply chain issues, the earliest it could arrive is in May.

➔ **Volunteers?** Pastor is seeking volunteers to assist with a few things: 1) update weekly copyright information on One License website; 2) mail bulletins to shut-ins; 3) Daily Rest renewal contact person; 4) various secretarial help with updating the yearbook.

Meeting opened with prayer. Roll call and minutes were suspended. Benno Sydow served as acting chairman and Roger Ochsner as acting secretary. March and First Quarter Treasurers reports were presented and approved.

Pastors Report

- Frank Radichel has done work on livestreaming services.
- Joseph Kwiwalazu has started the follow-through classes in Liberia.

- Volunteers needed: Update info. to One License for services, Daily Rest renewal, mail out bulletins, and other items.

Board of Education Report

- The constitution committee is reviewing verbiage changes where the unclear language may imply that the pastor is the principal of the school.
- The school webpage is being reviewed to make changes to indicate how to pursue enrollment in our school.
- Plans being made to participate in the Spring Lake Park Tower Days Parade. We cannot have handouts in Fridley parade, so we plan not to participate.
- A plan will need to be developed to switch the north and south school rooms this summer. Some maintenance (painting, floors, etc.) may be required.

Board of Trustees Report

- The LED lighting project is complete.

Other Business

- New Organ installation:
 - Barry Hay was here Sunday, March 27, to review physical requirements.
 - Looking at fabric to cover the speakers in the front.
 - Wiring from the organ to the speakers can run through some ducts.
 - Discussed changes to platform to accommodate organ, piano, and choir.
 - Could connect the piano in the back to the same speaker system.
 - Must remove items from the storage area behind the altar so Duane Enns can begin construction (holes in the walls, etc.)
 - Would be nice to see how the altar area would look when completed.
- Pastor will put a notice in the bulletin regarding the status of the organ fund.

General Fund – March offerings were \$73,610 (incl \$6,600 special) **VS** disbursements of \$113,845, a negative monthly cash flow of \$40,235, increasing the General Fund to its largest indebtedness, – \$174,614. YTD offerings are \$193,000 short of estimated budget needs, while YTD disbursements are \$19,000 below estimated expenses for the 9 months of the fiscal year. The Coordinating Council and the CLC boards meet for their Spring meeting April 25-27 & the increasing General Fund deficit may require some serious cuts to their FY23 budget proposals for June Convention consideration. The current year budget for the operation of our Boards of Missions, Regents, Trustees, and Ed-Pub is \$1,260,000. But there are still 3 months left in this fiscal year for the boards to curtail their spending & all of us to increase our support for the General Fund, trusting our Lord to bless our best efforts.

ILC Operations – March revenue was \$110,594 (\$61,667 subsidy) **VS** disbursements of \$126,129 (wages/benefits \$7,075), a negative monthly cash flow of – \$15,534, but still has a balance \$153,062.

IIF – March revenue: \$16,000 (bequest of \$14,719), **VS** \$0 disbursed. Div/Int income for **March & FYTD** were: \$877 & \$3,658. Principal market gain: \$915.

ILC Building Projects – March revenue: \$21,534 (bequest of \$14,719) **VS** \$4432 disbursed for architect. Div/Int income for **Mar & FYTD** were \$3,541 & \$31,447. Principal market gain: \$5,710

CEF – March revenue: \$27,964 loan repayments, \$40 offerings **VS** disbursements: \$12,685 Note paid off. Div/Int income **Mar & FYTD** were \$9,241 & \$74,699. Principal market gain: \$16,974.

MDF – March offerings \$20,700 (\$9,282 special) **VS** disbursements \$12,680 (\$3,400 Exploratory, \$3,815 building assistance, \$4,370 part time missionaries/conferences, \$1,094 for admin expenses).

SAF – March receipts: \$9,166 (\$6,149 loan repayments, \$3,017 special gift) **VS** \$7,725 disbursed for student grants/loans/scholarships. Div/Int income **Mar & FYTD**: Endowment: \$12,032 & \$42,040; PMP grant: \$14,790 & \$51,675; Scholarship Fund: \$976 & \$2,940. Principal market gain: \$29,827.

Kinship – March receipts: \$9,609 offerings/sponsors **VS** disbursed: \$19,837 (\$7,905, orphans; \$9,290 seminary students; \$2,500 medical assistance; \$90, widows).

**** Fluctuations in the chart revenue column for the ILC Building Projects, IIF, CEF, SAF, & Reserve Fund reflect gains & losses in portfolio values from market fluctuations each month. These are reported to help explain the changes in the fund balances, which also reflect disbursements from the funds. The Div/Int income is reported for the month & Fiscal YTD accumulations.**
