"This day have I begot my Son.

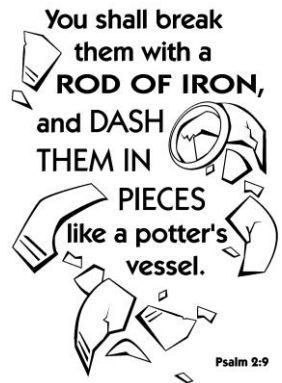
"Ascend, My Son, to My right hand,
