<u>CLC E-Devotion – May 26, 2022</u>

Luke 24:44 Then He said to them, "These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me."

Ascension Fulfillment

Jesus divides the Old Testament Word of truth into three sections: the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms. Sure enough, if you look into any one of those places, you will see your ascended Savior present and still blessing His church.

Jesus ascends into heaven

In the Law of Moses you will find that it was necessary for Jesus to die and rise again in the first Gospel promise in Genesis 3:15:

And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel.

We find in the prophets what Jesus came to do, for example in Isaiah 53:4:

Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted.

And in the Psalms you have the death of Jesus prophesied in Psalm 22 and learn of the resurrection in Psalm 16:9-10:

Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices; My flesh also will rest in hope. For You will not leave my soul in Sheol, Nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption.

We also now have the Gospels-and the entire New Testament-which show us how Jesus fulfilled the Scriptures and open our eyes to see our Savior with the eyes of faith. With the last words of Revelation we have the assurance that we have the complete Word of truth. There is nothing more to be added, and the Word will never change. Jesus continues to bless His church by preserving the Word so that we may know Him as our ascended Lord and ever-present Savior.

Grace School Update

This past Thursday Grace Lutheran School concluded its 2021-22 school year. The LORD certainly showered the school year with many blessings, including the opportunity to minister to the 28 young lambs of God that we were privileged to serve with the Good News of salvation through their Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ.



The evening before closing there were over 100 people in attendance packed in the fellowship hall to watch the children perform their school play. A lot of conversation and support for the school followed. In fact, as school closed on Thursday, a grandmother of one of the non-member students gave a beautiful and encouraging speech in front of all the students and their parents to express her genuine appreciation for all that the school does in educating not only her grandchildren, but all the students. She had fondly observed the closeness and intimacy that the school offers with its family atmosphere and caring touch. The speech was quite inspiring to listen to as she thanked Grace Lutheran Church for providing and supporting this school. It would have been wonderful if this could have been relayed directly to the congregation and may have surprised many among us to hear such uplifting compliments.

Even before school closed, new and different contacts reached out to the teaching staff about potential registration for the 2022-23 school year. These parents met with Mrs. and Pastor Hein during this past week. One was a single mother of a potential 6th grader and then a set of parents with a 5th grader who also have a pre-schooler and a baby on the way. After learning about our school and church, these contacts had a sincere interest in sending their children. But according to Grace's current plan, Mrs. Hein had to inform them that their children would have to be placed on a waiting list as her 3rd-8th grade classroom had already reached maximum capacity at 20 students. The only classroom that could handle more students would be Mrs. Nelson's classroom for K-2nd grade as we expect 9 students. Last summer other families were placed on a waiting list since we believed the school had already reached capacity. But we are already at this point, amazingly even before our current school year had ended! To announce this news to these eager parents was agonizing and devastating for the staff. It was heartbreaking to see the disappointment in the interested parents. These were quality contacts with a sincere interest in their children receiving a quality Christian education. In fact, even after being told that their children would likely be unable to attend our school, their interest continued as they asked what could possibly make it a reality. The single mother is already interested in instruction classes with Pastor given how our church fits many of the features for which she has been searching. The couple is also searching for church and could possibly be interested in learning more about us.

After praying and thinking about the current plans, Mrs. Hein conveyed to the Board of Education that she would be willing to do whatever could be done to accommodate these families. The Board of Education is now reevaluating its current plan and attempting to creatively come up with new plans to address the interest we are now observing. When phoning these contacts with this news, one parent started crying in appreciation for the opportunity her child had to attend Grace.

These situations are being reported to the congregation for a couple reasons:

1) To relay to the congregation and help it understand and be aware how keeping things as they have been in the school are making it quite challenging for the school's staff

2) To convey how turning away students may be impacting potential interest in our church and certainly the ministry of the Word to those who desire it for their children

For the past few years pastor has been reporting to the congregation how there has been a growing interest in the school and the great need for us to be prepared for this. Many concerned parents are seeking for their children a solid Christian education and Christ-centered foundation that isn't polluted with many of the ungodly and immoral philosophies being promoted in our current secular society. The contacts we've had have been surprised to find a Christian school like ours, even wondering why it is so small when it appears to be such a significant blessing. Those non-members who have sent their children have time and again expressed their sincere appreciation to the staff for what their children are receiving, eager to promote our school but knowing our potential inability to expand. Who knows what is being communicated in our community when we end up turning away contacts to our school? What message are we giving to the world about our church? These are questions we all need to consider and be mindful about as we face and address this positive challenge that is before us.

This announcement is to open the door for more conversation in our congregation about the school. Some of the various issues have been raised, but not really discussed thoroughly or openly as a church even though the teaching staff and the Board of Education have certainly wrestled with the situation. As a result, there has been a "spinning of the wheels" as to how to proceed. Obviously the school is here primarily for our member children to have a thorough training in the Word of God. This is always communicated to our non-member families with the secondary goal to reach out to the world with the Word of God, thus including them in our school as well. But questions have been raised about what the ratio of member to non-member students should be. For a number of years it has been about 50% each. Would the congregation support having more non-members enrolled? Does the education of our members get negatively impacted should more nonmembers attend? Some of these questions are addressed during the non-member enrollment process as the staff always relays that Grace Lutheran will do what is necessary to retain the guality of education by a continuous evaluation of a student's enrollment, even terminating enrollment if it means preserving the learning atmosphere that we offer all our students. Given that parents desire to have a first-rate Christian education, this is well understood and accepted as being necessary.

Also, can the congregation think of ways to expand the enrollment through other means, even for the upcoming year? Can we open Mrs. Hein's sliding classroom door and expand into the fellowship hall? Should we ask for more volunteers from the congregation to help the teachers in their expanding workload? Our school has been greatly blessed by the many volunteers who already are engaged and helpful in their assistance to the teachers. Would there be enough support for another full-time teacher so that the classes could be divided up more equally in the three different classrooms? Should tuition for nonmembers be increased? Should tuition be charged to our members?

All these questions have been asked, reconsidered, and discussed by the teachers and the Board of Education. This summer we still have two upcoming events to help promote our school with the advertising we do

in the Spring Lake Park parade and with Vacation Bible School having been a boost to our school's enrollment in the past. These are two of the biggest ways that we make ourselves known in the community. Only the LORD knows what the interest level will be by the end of this summer as He lays before us opportunities to share the Good News of His marvelous salvation plan in which we ourselves find great delight.

It has become clear to the staff and Board of Education that our school is becoming a big draw as it shines as a beacon in the midst of the darkness that this world offers. Do we all understand this? Can we continue with things as they are? Are we ready to see how the LORD will lead us as we minister to these young lambs? Let us turn to Him in prayer, humbly seek His wisdom, and consider how we can address these issues as we rely on Him and His good pleasure. The Board of Education certainly welcomes your input and ideas regarding this: James Bomber, Roger Ochsner, Tom Graham.
