CLC Financial Report - October

- **General Fund October** offerings were **\$61,898 VS** disbursements of **\$100,537**. October offerings fell short of actual expenses by \$38,639, and were \$6,103 short of average monthly budget needs of \$106,640. The General Fund annual budget is \$1,279,680 and subsidizes the work of the Boards of Missions, Trustees, EdPub, & Regents, and are sometimes referred to as "CLC Mission offerings."
- **CLC Reserve Fund** (above) is held in our Investment Pool account until needed, typically each fiscal year-end. The <u>negative</u> amount for October reflects the market effect on the Fund value since 7/1/22. Sept was down –\$18,964, so October actually recovered by \$9,000. FY23 Div/Int income YTD: \$5,023,
- **ILC Operations October** revenue was **\$114,307** (including \$63,810 General Fund monthly subsidy) **VS** disbursements of **\$116,159**. Regents annual budget is \$1,552,000, incl CLC Gen Fund subsidy.
- **IIF October** receipts: **\$6,985** (\$2,453/mo bequest) **VS \$0** disbursed. FY23 Div/Int income: \$2,142.
- ILC Bldg October receipts: \$105,138 (\$60,000 individual gift, \$38,270 capital gains, \$2,453/mo bequest) VS disbursed: \$0. <u>FY23 Div/Int income YTD</u>: \$19,454.
- CEF October receipts: **\$97,847** (\$71,798 capital gains, \$25,909 loan repayments & \$140 gifts) VS disbursed: **\$3,991** admin expense. <u>FY23 Div/Int income YTD</u>: \$40,086.
- **MDF October** receipts: **\$6,426 VS** disbursed **\$38,934**; (\$26,395 Church Bldg Assist; \$3,935 Outreach Africa; \$7,000 Area Pastoral Conferences; \$1,117 admin expenses).
- **SAF October** receipts: **\$11,060** (\$9,635, Student loan repayments; \$1,425 special gifts) **VS** disbursed: **\$6,238** (\$5,144 STU grants, loans, scholarships; \$1,095 admin). <u>FY23 Div/Int YTD</u> <u>Income</u>: <u>SAF</u>: \$22,288; <u>PMP Fund</u>: \$26,971; <u>Scholarship Fund</u>: \$1,781.
- Kinship October receipts: **\$6,450**: (\$4,171 offerings, \$2,250 sponsors) VS disbursed: **\$4,713**: (includes \$4,443 Medical Assistance).
- ** Positive & negative values in the <u>revenue</u> column (2nd above) reflect market fluctuations of long term invested funds of the ILC Building Projects, IIF, CEF, SAF, & Reserve funds in their portfolio's.
