As a reminder, communicants are to examine themselves prior to communing. 1 Corinthians 11:27: "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup."

Prayer before the Lord's Supper:

Lord God, You invite all who are burdened with sin to come to You for rest. In the sacrament of Holy Baptism You called me to be Your child by the Holy Spirit. I now come at Your invitation to receive the holy body and blood of my Savior, Jesus Christ, in the sacrament of Holy Communion. Prepare my heart, Lord, to receive this precious meal with a repentant heart: sorry for my sins and recognizing they deserve punishment, but also rejoicing in the full forgiveness You have granted me by grace through Jesus' holy and precious blood shed for me at the cross. Strengthen my faith, increase my love and hope in You, and assure me of Your blessed peace. Hear me for the sake of Jesus, my dear Savior. Amen.

Blessed Savior, Jesus Christ, You have given Yourself to me in this holy sacrament. Thanks and praise be to You for Your divine tenderness and love shown to me, Your child. I humbly ask you, now that I've received Your body and blood in the Sacrament, continue to fill me with the power of Your Holy Spirit. May I be led to ever embrace by faith the treasures of Your grace imparted to me, especially the forgiveness of sins and fellowship with You. Keep me in Your faith and favor that I may live in You and You may live in me. Let the love that You have shown me enable me, with a forgiven and tender heart, to love You and my neighbor. Preserve me in the true faith until everlasting life. Hear me, O Jesus, for the sake of Your dear name. Amen.

- Dan Kelley has completed adult instruction class with Pastor. In agreement with our doctrine, he intends to get baptized on Sept. 10 and publicly profess his faith on the same day.

Other Business

- A Health Reimbursement Account was described. It would not affect the staff insurance accounts. In 2019 our group insurance was declined based on MN state law. The intent of the account would be to cover insurance deductible and insurance premium up to a preset limit. Motion approved to more fully investigate HRAs with the intent to implement them.
- Employee Retention Credit documentation has been submitted. We hope to get about \$6,000 from the government in about 6 months.
- The Gusto Payroll system was presented. It would greatly simplify the treasurer's job in dealing with payroll and government requirements. The Realm system for contribution and accounting was presented. A motion approved to implement the Gusto and Realm systems.
- The Fidelity account we have can do what the Wells Fargo brokerage account can do. A motion approved to delete the Wells Fargo brokerage account. Adapted from minutes submitted by Secretary Frank Radichel

General Fund – July offerings: **\$112,871** (Special: \$23,680) **VS** disbursements: **\$111,360**, for a <u>positive</u> cash flow of \$1,511 Note the \$0 balances for the General Fund & ILC Operations to begin the new fiscal year July 1. At the fiscal year end June 30, the CLC Reserve Fund <u>receives</u> positive balances from any unspent Board subsidies & General Fund positive balances, or <u>pays</u> year end deficits of the 4 Boards & the General Fund. All of the other fund balances carry over, as can be seen above, since they receive no subsidy. Annual General Fund Budget: \$1,191,682.

- **CLC Reserve Fund** holds funds from earlier years when there were fewer expenses and extra funds to invest in our Investment Pool account to grow until needed, typically at the end of a deficit fiscal year. Balance on 6/30: \$196,703. After the General Fund deficit payoff of \$101,148 on 7/1, the Reserve balance to begin FY24 was \$95,555.
- **ILC Operations July** receipts: **\$66,428 VS** disbursements: **\$155,134** (incl \$92,076 Wages; \$42,709 Property Insurance; \$6,873, Admin.) The <u>ILC</u> Operating budget was positive the last fiscal year and will recover from the July shortfall with student revenues when school resumes. Annual ILC Budget: \$1,638,312.
- **IIF July** receipts: **\$2,674** (\$2,453/mo bequest; \$221 offerings) **VS** disbursements: **\$45,119** (incl \$45,000 hail damage repairs.)
- **ILC Bldg July** receipts: **\$26,159**; (\$2,453 monthly bequest; \$3,346 offerings \$20,360 market value increase of investments) VS disbursed: **\$51,882** (building plans).
- CEF July receipts: \$63,959 (incl \$22,291 P&I payments \$41,628 market value increase of investments) VS disbursed: \$16,779 (\$12,827 Notes repaid; \$3,952 Admin.)
- **MDF July** receipts: **\$5,446** (Offerings) **VS** disbursed **\$20,055** (incl \$2,207 Computer; \$2,800 Bicycles; \$2,935 Exploratory; \$5,000 Bidg Assist; \$6,007 Missionaries & Edu.)

SAF – July Rcpts: \$6,143 (\$1,376 Gifts; \$4,767 P&I payments) VS Disb: \$948
