Congregational Singing

Sing to the Lord a new song! The congregation of saints should praise Him. Psalm 149:1.

The New Song encourages people to join in congregational singing, and rich blessings result also from such congregational singing.

A well-known commentator made this very significant statement in this regard: "When Christians sing and pray with each other, they stir up and build up and inspire one another. Through congregational singing and praying and confessing, the heart and spirit and soul are mightily exalted, are drawn closer to God and to Christ, and the heart is aroused to rejoice in the Lord and in God's salvation."

Such experiences are surely familiar to many Christians. The psalmist, King David, spoke of it from personal experience. That was his innermost prayer, that he might take part in a congregational worship service and in congregational singing.

Thousands of Christians in many countries are not permitted to sing as a congregation. All who live in a free country should thank God, and make conscientious use of their wonderful privilege!

I thank Thee, O God, in the assembly of those who are devout and in the congregation. Amen

The Blessing of Congregational Singing.

I will thank Thee in the great congregation, and praise Thee in a large gathering of people. Psalm 35:18.

Luther often emphasized that the congregational singing of the New Song was a great blessing.

In the year 1524, the first Lutheran hymn book appeared with 8 hymns.

Concerning the proclamation of the Word in the worship service, Luther said: "The music or the notes, like wonderful creatures and gifts of God, serve a very good purpose, especially when the people sing along, and it proceeds very fervently."

During the time of the Reformation, people often experienced the blessings of congregational singing. A theologian by the name of Hesshusius said: "I do not doubt that through this one hymn of Luther" - namely, "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice," TLH 387 - "many hundreds of Christians have been brought to the true faith who before could not endure the name of Luther; but the noble, precious words of the hymn have won their hearts, so that they are constrained to embrace the truth, so that in my opinion the hymns have helped the spread of the Gospel not a little."

The congregational singing of the New Song works mightily!

Lead us, O Lord, that we may continue steadfastly in the Apostles' doctrine and in the fellowship. Amen.

Council Meeting Notes - October 1, 2023

Meeting opened with prayer. September Council meeting minutes were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report

- The September Treasurer's Report was presented and approved.
- Motion approved to use the project undesignated fund to make up any difference between the carpet bill and the sanctuary improvement fund balance when the bill comes due.
- Motion approved to pay \$1200 fall tuition for each of the two Grace ILHS students.

Board of Elders' Report

- Motion approved to recommend to the Voters the 2024 church calendar.
- The Elders are postponing discussion of counters teams until November.

Board of Education Report

- The board met with teachers on September 13. They discussed the duties
 of the co principals. Ellen deals with local and state agencies. Janelle is
 responsible for academics, discipline, and parent interface. They also
 reviewed the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act that deals with
 confidentiality of student records.
- The parent/teachers conferences will be held on October 16.
- The fall break for the students will be October 16-20.
- The CLC teachers' conference will be held October 18-20.

- Benno has entered the counters' info for services from the beginning of the 2023 into the new Realm accounting system. He found some counting errors. He has corrected some of the errors and will be addressing others as time permits. Counters are reminded that "posting" in the new system should be done after reconciliation with the bank. The new system is working nicely. The accounting portion of the system needs to be finalized so that reports can be generated directly from the system.
- The September payroll was disbursed using the new payroll system with one issue that is being fixed. The next step is to verify that payroll tax processing and reporting will be done correctly.

Budgeting


The initial 2024 budget as presented by the boards was:

- General budgeting approach.
- The treasurer will send out updated information. The council will discuss
 the budget over email and then resume the meeting to finalize
 recommendations before the October voters' meeting.
- Motion approved to set the top number at a planning target of \$255,000.
- Motion approved to recess the meeting.
- The meeting resumed October 11, at 7:57 p.m.
- Three budget options to be discussed.
- Motion failed to set the budget at \$255000 with Education at \$131800, Elders at \$84200 and Trustees at \$39000.
- Motion approved to recess the meeting.
- The meeting resumed October 12, at 7:50 p.m.
- Five options were reviewed.
- Motion approved to set the budget at \$254,953 with Education at \$136,523, Elders at \$79,430 and Trustees at \$39,000.
