December Letter

Have you caught the Christmas spirit yet? But what is Christmas spirit exactly? Is it being wrapped in a warm blanket, with a cup of hot chocolate in your hand, as you gaze at the tree decked out with tinsel and glowing lights? Is it the clerk behind the counter a little friendlier, a little more helpful, than at other times of the year? Is it the smell of cookies baking in the oven as you come in from the cold? Is it taking a grocery bag of food and a few toys to a needy family? Or is it like one of those Hallmark commercials designed to leave you a little misty-eyed?

You and I know true Christmas spirit is none of the above. We know that these sorts of things, though fine in themselves, give no true and lasting meaning to our lives. If we try to catch the spirit of Christmas from outward trappings and sentimental experiences, our celebration will fall flat. How often don't people wear themselves out trying to create the right holiday atmosphere only to find themselves let down because their dream of what they think Christmas should be didn't live up to expectations?

What about you and me? Yes, we know there's much more to Christmas than snow on Christmas Eve or finding our loved ones the perfect gift. Yet, if we are not careful, your Christmas and mine could fall flat as well. Tell me, are we already getting a little stressed over how extra busy we will be in the weeks ahead? (Let's see, how many sermons will we have to write and preach before the New Year rolls around?) I don't know about you, but it's happened to me that I get so busy helping God's people see the true and profound meaning of Christmas that I fail to take the time to go back in spirit to Bethlehem for myself so that I may personally breathe in the wonder of this thing which has come to pass.

We are sinners every bit as much as the people we serve. Our need to catch the true spirit of Christmas is as great as anyone else's. Like Mary, let us then, take personal time to ponder God's Indescribable Gift, a Savior born for all people. Led by the Spirit and Word let us go on bended knee into the sanctuary of the Bethlehem stable. It is cold and cruel out in the world, but here it is warm and safe. For our God is here, wrapped in swaddling clothes, come down from heaven to rescue us from the threatening perils of our sins. We are not so strong, but with Him nothing is impossible. We are not so wise, but in His Word we have true light to guide us through all the dark confusion of this present evil age. We are not worthy whatsoever to come into His presence, but He

invites us still. For He is our God of grace and mercy, and we are His dearly loved people.

The Child we worship came to die and to suffer hell itself in payment for your sins and mine. In His rising again the Third Day we see the ultimate reality of Christmas – a Savior come to our world to break the power of sin, death, and the devil over our lives once and for all.

Paul Gerhardt caught the true spirit of Christmas in these stanzas from TLH hymn #90:

From the bondage that oppressed us, From sin's fetters that possessed us, From the grief that sore distressed us, We, the captives, now are free.

Gracious Child, we pray Thee, hear us, From Thy lowly manger cheer us, Gently lead us and be near us Till we join the angelic choir.

May the Christmas Gospel give you all a spirit of awe and wonder as we kneel together in humble faith before Christ's manger bed. In the weeks ahead may the Spirit bless your Gospel preaching to God's glory and for the edifying of His blood-bought people.
