Sermon: Jonah 3:1-10

¹ Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you." ³ So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, a three-day journey *in extent.* ⁴ And Jonah began to enter the city on the first day's walk. Then he cried out and said, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" ⁵ So the people of Nineveh believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them. ⁶ Then word came to the king of Nineveh; and he arose from his throne and laid aside his robe, covered *himself* with sackcloth and sat in ashes. ⁷ And he caused *it* to be proclaimed and published throughout Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything; do not let them eat, or drink water. ⁸ But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily to God; yes, let every one turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. ⁹ Who can tell *if* God will turn and relent, and turn away from His fierce anger, so that we may not perish? ¹⁰ Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it. CLC Financial Report - December

- **General Fund December** receipts: **\$95,712 VS** disbursements: **\$80,264.** The General Fund subsidizes the work of the Boards of Missions, Trustees, EdPub, & Regents (including ILC.)
- ILC Operations December receipts: \$177,091 VS disbursements: \$131,688.
- IIF December receipts: \$3,318 VS disbursements: \$1,257.
- ILC Building Projects December receipts: \$59,317 (including an \$52,628 increase in market value of investments) VS disbursements: None.
- **MDF December** receipts: **\$19,201 VS** disbursements: **\$16,431** (including \$5,000 for a vehicle).
- Kinship December receipts: \$9,150 VS disbursements: \$2,517.
- **CEF December** receipts: **\$116,538** (including a \$91,237 increase in market value of investments) **VS** disbursements: **\$16,250** (mostly payments on member loans to the CEF).
- **SAF December** receipts: **\$6,154 VS d**isbursements: **\$38,273** (including student loans, grants, scholarships and tuition assistance).
- **Reserve Fund** is currently invested in a money market account until needed, typically each fiscal year-end.
- EduK8 Fund December receipts: \$288. Balance \$35,247.

Council Meeting Notes – January 14, 2024

Meeting opened with prayer: December Council meeting minutes were read, edited, and approved. December Treasurer's Report was presented and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Letters were sent to Charles Davis, Vanessa Vandeveer, and Sarah Yannarelly informing them that we will bring the topic of their membership to the voters.
- We had a joint service with Pastor Joseph's church in Liberia. The service went well. Pastor has shared the video of the service with others.
- Midweek Lent worship starts Feb. 14 with a pulpit exchange as in the past.
- Todd Ohlmann and Joel Krafft were not able to go to Liberia as planned because they didn't get their passports and visas back from the Liberian consulate in time.

Board of Elders' Report

- Motion approved to recommend \$59,020 as the Cooperative Budget Plan number for 2024 to the Voters.
- The secretary will send Voter attendance statistics to the Elders.
- Elders have decided not to change the counter and usher teams.
- There was a suggestion to submit an announcement to Lutheran Spokesman about the joint service we had with Joseph's congregation in Liberia.

Board of Education Report

- There will be parent/teacher conferences Jan. 15.
- The school year is progressing well. Teachers and parents are thankful for the staffing changes that have been made this year with the Kindergarten teacher.
- Non-member feedback on the school has been good.

Board of Trustees' Report

- A workday is scheduled on Jan. 27, 9 am.
- Grace is using same snow plowing service. FYI Landscaping is the name of the service.
- Trustees moved the water filter to the sink that is near the coffee machine.

Other Business

- Ballots for the voters' meeting elections have been prepared.
- The sanctuary altar area renderings are being displayed. Survey forms are available. Members are encouraged to fill out the survey forms so that the committee can get feedback from the members. The committee plans to have a congregational meeting to review the renderings and surveys.
- Kevin requests that the Google Drive include a place that files can be stored and shared so that boards can keep track of info. as board members change over time.
- Benno shared a report giving information about envelopes, offering statements, and some giving trends. Kevin reminded us to give "not grudgingly of necessity," it is our opportunity to be on God's team. Rick reminded us to remember that we can give of our time as well as our money.
- Phil reported that we have finished the first year on the new payroll system.
- Pastor talked about his cancer. He doesn't want it to be said that he battled with his cancer. He gave the reminder from Scripture that it is the LORD who does the battling. Pastor thanks Rick for the passage he shared on t-shirts in his Christmas gift. Exodus 14:14, "The Lord will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace."
