Mark 1:22 And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes.

Jesus Teaches with Authority

When it comes to teaching methods, there are about as many different methods as there are teachers. There's the classic lecture method that I'm sure we've all experienced at some point. There's the discussion method and the problem-solving method, the project method and the inductive method, and many others. I think if we had to give a name to Jesus' method of teaching, we might call it the authoritative method.

When Jesus taught His first lesson that Sabbath in the Capernaum synagogue, we're told that His students were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. Jesus did not say, "Thus says the Lord," but rather, "Thus say I."

It's easy to see why His students were astonished. Just imagine how amazing it must have been to hear Him preach and teach-to listen to Him explain Old Testament prophecies and make prophecies of His own about His crucifixion and resurrection and even the end of the world.

But wait, you don't have to imagine it. For you, too, are one of Jesus' disciples! In the same way that Jesus called Peter, Andrew, James, and John to follow Him, so Jesus has called you. His Word gives us the strength to cast away the things that distract us, and follow Him, learn from Him, and praise Him.

In the same way that Jesus taught His disciples with authority, He still does the same today. Every time you open your Bible and read about Jesus, He is speaking directly to you, strengthening you and encouraging you by the power of His Word. His Word gives life and strength to His students. As Paul writes in Romans 10:17 So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

Are you wanting a stronger faith? Are you looking for strength to endure all the challenges and trials of this sinful life? Then hear the Words of Christ-that's where faith comes from! That's how faith grows and matures-through the living and abiding Word of God. So, remain steadfast in the Word. Surround yourself with it every day. Read these daily devotions, subscribe to the CLC's Daily Rest devotional, sign up for one of the many daily Bible verse text message services. As Jesus' students, we can't get enough of His strengthening Word!
