
CLC E-Devotion – August 11, 2016

Acts 11:20 But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who came to Antioch and began speaking to the Greeks also, evangelizing about the Lord Jesus...

CENTERS

In the eleventh chapter of Acts, we have an interesting bit of history: how the center of Christian witness shifted from Jerusalem to Antioch. This is interesting because it occasionally shifts also in our day. You and I may worship in America. But our ancestors came from around the world, and many studied God's Word far away from here. The center of our Christian witness can change.

Not that some church leaders sat down and decided, "We think that Antioch would serve as a better center for



spreading Christianity." No, it was the persecution that followed Stephen's martyrdom that scattered the believers. But they took with them the good news of Jesus wherever they went. At first they conversed only with fellow Jews. Then some men from the Mediterranean island of Cypress and the African city of Cyrene came to Antioch and talked with non-Jews. It doesn't say they preached, but just that they talked with some non-Jews of Antioch, speaking the good news about Jesus, and the hand of the Lord was with them, and many believed.

Many times God has used his children in this way. They were not all preachers. But, scattered by a variety of circumstances (sometimes even disasters), people, talking with the people they met, have told them the history of Jesus and what a future that history had given them. They did this not because they felt guilty about their failures to do mission work, but from the joy that overflowed their hearts because the love of God had been poured out upon them in Jesus, their Savior and King.

CLC President's Letter – May 2024

"Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" – 1 Corinthians 15:57.

Dear Brothers,

I grew up at a time when Westerns ruled the silver screen. My brothers and I couldn't get enough of the likes of John Wayne, Jimmy Stewart, Gary Cooper, and many others. With their quick draw and a steady aim the bad guys didn't stand a chance. Every night we could also find a good western on our old black and white. TV series like Gunsmoke, Bonanza, and the Big Valley were some of our favorites; and, if we weren't throwing the football around, we were roaming the neighborhood, decked out in our Stetsons and cowboy boots, with our six shooters close by our side. And, no matter what, whether it was on the screen or in our play, the good guys always won.

In real life it sure doesn't seem to be that way, does it? In fact, most days it looks like evil is winning. Forty years ago, a writer described the culture back then as one which was slouching toward Gomorrah. Today, it would seem that we are living right smack dab in the middle of Gomorrah. While it's doubtful that our nation has ever been a truly Christian nation, yet, not so long ago, there was a much greater understanding among the general population about the difference



between right and wrong. Not so day. We live in a time where evil is said to be good, and where good is labeled as evil. Nothing is sacred nowadays, and few know what it means to feel shame. It's not that people were any less sinful fifty years ago than they are today. It's that Satan, through media and other means, has managed to dull the collective conscience of our nation. The idea that humanity needs to be rescued from hell rings hollow in a culture where sin has become a foreign concept. Thus, the Gospel is regarded as an outdated message, not one that any intelligent person would ever take seriously.

No question about it, the days are growing increasingly evil. But does that mean Satan is winning? Does it mean we should throw up our

hands in defeat? Not at all! The truth of the matter is that Satan has already lost. On the cross the punishment that sin deserves was laid upon Christ. He paid it all for all. His death on the cross erases whatever guilty accusations that Satan may try to hurl our way. By our Savior's resurrection, Satan has been routed and death and hell have been forever vanquished. With His descent into hell, Christ has made a public demonstration to all there, showing his triumph over all evil. As the Ascended King of kings, Christ continues to win every moment of every day, working all things together for the good of His Church. Satan may think himself clever, but he's actually the biggest loser ever

While we dare never take that roaring lion lightly, let us remember that in Christ we are more than conquerors. Rather than sit back and shake our heads at the present state of affairs, let us take up the Sword of the Spirit and go on the offensive. Satan can only cower in fear as we take aim at him with God's mighty Word. It's high noon in this present evil age. The foes are fierce, and we seem greatly outnumbered. But they cannot win.
