Why Send Our Children to Grace Lutheran School?

This question is one that many parents may have asked themselves at the beginning of each new school year. Perhaps you wonder, will my child get a good quality education if he/she attends Grace Lutheran School? Won't he/she fall behind his/her peers with fewer opportunities for social contact with children of a similar age?

It is not our goal to compete with public schools. We share a similar goal in that we seek to educate our children in reading, writing, and arithmetic. But while the public schools prepare children for life in this world, we seek to prepare them both for their lives as <u>Children of God</u> in this world and for eternal life in the world to come. For this reason –

- ➡ In our school the children receive a <u>Christ-centered</u> education with daily training from the Word of God. Not only is the child's faith built up through daily devotions, every subject is taught from the viewpoint of God's authoritative and inspired Word in the Bible.
- We use <u>God's powerful Word</u> to teach the children real values and morals based upon the 10 Commandments and the Gospel of Christ. Both <u>Law and Gospel</u> are brought to bear, for it is the Law that uncovers sin; but the Good News of what Christ alone has done for our forgiveness and salvation can create both the willingness and ability to live a Christ-like life.

But do our children receive a quality education? Do they advance to the same extent that their peers in the public schools do? Yes. In fact, our students historically receive higher-than-grade-level scores on standardized tests which evaluate each student's progress. Why is this?

Subject Matter. We teach subjects without getting into social engineering and emphasize basic truths of every subject matter.

Size. In our school the teacher-to-student ratio favors the students. Every child receives considerable personal attention. This type of 'hands on' teaching leads to real learning and advancement. By the conclusion of our last school year some of the students have already advanced to complete portions of their next grade level.

Well, maybe the education is comparable or even better, but won't the children lack social awareness with such a sheltered education? No.

 Students learn to communicate and function alongside children of different age groups. They learn self-control and manners as they deal with the teacher and other students in a one-room school. They develop lasting relationships with students who have more in common than age. They share a common faith in Jesus Christ.

Voter Meeting Notes – July 21, 2024

Meeting opened with prayer. April Voters' meeting minutes were read and approved. The second quarter Treasurer's Report was presented and approved. We are now using dates from bank statements in the reports.

Pastor's Report

- Confirmation went well on May 19. Motion approved to ratify Lucas Boe, Cam Nelson, and Reagan Oman as communicant members.
- Pastor baptized Journey and Phoenix Gartner, two children of a nonmember, Vanessa Gartner, on 6/16.
- Pastor recently baptized Lozen Inez Hicks, daughter of Karie (nee Davis) and Malachi Hicks, on 6/30.
- MN delegate conference at Grace went well. Thanks to all who helped.
- The CLC Convention went well. Tom and Benno were delegates.
- Pastor Delwyn Maas has accepted our invitation for Mission Festival.
- Laura Wales will be installed next Sun. as the part-time kindergarten teacher.
- Premarital counseling with John Maki and Maddie Olson is completed.
- The Elders did not have anything to report.

Board of Education Report

- Laura Wales accepted the part-time kindergarten teacher call. She will have 4 prekindergarten & 2 kindergarten students. There will not be any preschool.
- \$33,350 in non-member tuition is expected in the 2024-25 school year.
- Motion approved to ratify Eli Wales as Sunday School Superintendent.

Board of Trustees' Report

- The work on lilacs has gone well. About 33% of the growth was cut out by removing larger branches. There is some more work on the lilacs to be done.
- Grace Church work day is coming on July 27.

Other Business

- Rick presented the results of the altar sanctuary survey with 75 responses. 63.6% of the communicants voted. Four options voting: 5.33% (#4), 8.45% (#2), with #1 (base altar w/cross) & #3 (keep original altar) got 46.43% & 45.07% (not revealed which % went with which option). Motion withdrawn to have a paper ballot and vote on option 1 or 3. Motion approved to ask the sanctuary committee to develop a completely new option for the altar.
- Phil presented options relating to online giving. He also listed what online giving services some other CLC congregations use. Motion approved to ask the Council to appoint a Voter to investigate online giving with the goal of making a recommendation to the Voters.

June is the end of our fiscal year, so it is a good time to look back and see how the year ended up financially. In the table above, under Operating Funds, you will see the revenue and disbursements for the **General Fund** and for **ILC Operations**. Comparing them to the budget for the year, contributions were \$96,352 less than the amount budgeted for the **General Fund**, and disbursements were \$26,264 less than budget, resulting in a shortfall of \$70,088. Thankfully, **ILC Operations** had \$25,091 more in revenue than was budgeted, and disbursements were \$23,470 less than budget, resulting in a positive balance for the year of \$48,561. Because the **General Fund** subsidizes **ILC Operations**, the balance that is left in **ILC Operations** is closed out to the **General Fund**. Netting the two still leaves the **General Fund** \$21,527 in the hole for the year. Consequently, that amount is pulled from the **Reserve Fund** to get the balance in the **General Fund** to zero at June 30. This leaves a balance of \$79,964 in the **Reserve Fund** to carry forward to future years.

- For the new fiscal year beginning in July 2024, the convention passed a **General Fund** budget for contributions of \$1,312,993, which is an increase of 10.2% over last year's budget and 19.9% more than what was received last year. Most of the increase in the new budget is the result of a \$50,000 increase "for the purpose of assisting CLC congregations in the establishment and ongoing support of Christian Day Schools", the cost of moving half of the third missionary salary from MDF to the **General Fund**, along with salary increases.
- For the **Auxiliary Funds** you can look at the numbers above to see how each of them fared. The revenue in the **Auxiliary Funds** included over \$450,000 that came by way of market gains for the year on the investments in **ILC Building Projects** and the **Church Extension Fund**.

Overall, it was truly a very good year financially. With the substantial budget increase, your prayers, consideration, and contributions are needed for the new year.
