Peter answered and said to Him, "You are the Christ." ³⁰ Then He strictly warned them that they should tell no one about Him. ³¹ And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. ³² He spoke this word openly. And Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him. ³³ But when He had turned around and looked at His disciples, He rebuked Peter, saying, "Get behind Me, Satan! For you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men." ³⁴ When He had called the people to *Himself*, with His disciples also, He said to them, "Whoever desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. ³⁵ "For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it." (*NKJV*TM)

Council Meeting Notes – September 8, 2024

Meeting opened w/prayer. August Council meeting minutes were read and approved. August treasurer's report was presented and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Madeline Olson & John Maki were married on August 31.
- There are no public school students in catechism class this year. There are 8
 CDS students in confirmation class.
- Sunday School will have three levels this year. Heidi Nelson will teach level 1; Mikey Oman level 3 (1st-4th graders). Laura Wales level 4 (5th-8th graders).
- Pastoral conference will be held October 6-8.

Board of Elders' Report

• Church picnic will be Sept. 15. Elders will provide buns, grilled hot dogs & brats.

Board of Education Report

- The co-principals report that school is progressing nicely.
- Rick and Kevin will see if the city of Fridley can provide any playground equipment that Grace could have.
- \$6138.88 non-member tuition has been collected.
- Sexual abuse prevention training is taking some time to complete. It will be completed and documented.
- The board is starting to work on the budget for next year. The treasurer will send year to date spending and related budget information to the council.

Board of Trustees' Report

- Thanks to Benno for reorganizing the store room.
- The board will check with members of Grace or other CLC congregations to see if they could use the old chair rack.

Other Business

- Background checks are complete for the substitute teachers and the full-time workers. They all passed the background checks. The background check documentation is stored in the safe.
- Rick will order some additional staff shirts.
- Kevin met with Phil and Benno to discuss online giving. The goal of this service would be to make things easier for donors, the financial secretary, counters, and the treasurer. Realm Vanco online offering service would be the easiest to use. Vanco would have a 1% fee. Planning Center has a competitive service that would have a smaller fee. Planning Center contributions could import into Realm. Kevin thinks we should try to work with the donors to see if the Planning Center could work. There will be follow-up investigation and discussions.
- Rick reported that Jeff has suggested that we consider reconfiguring the church altar periodically. The Sanctuary Committee doesn't think this would be a good permanent solution. They are considering other options.
- The first day of school at Grace was Sept. 7, 1976. We are planning some type of celebration in 2026, the 50th anniversary. Alumni will be informed. A slide show could be made. Memorabilia could be assembled and displayed.
- The 70th anniversary of the Grace congregation is coming July 2025.

While John Calvin's theology may not be entirely in line with Scripture, particularly with his teaching on double predestination, the following quote from him is very weighty regarding abortion ...

Passages referenced:

Psalm 139:16 Your eyes saw my substance, being yet unformed. And in Your book they all were written, The days fashioned for me, When *as yet there were* none of them.

Exodus 21:22-24 "If men fight, and hurt a woman with child, so that she gives birth prematurely, yet no harm follows, he shall surely be punished accordingly as the woman's husband imposes on him; and he shall pay as the judges *determine*. ²³ "But if *any* harm follows, then you shall give life for life, ²⁴ "eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, ..."

From X:

John Calvin commenting on Psalm 139:16:

"The embryo, when first conceived in the womb, has no form; and David speaks of God's having known him when he was yet a shapeless mass, to *kuema*, as the Greeks term it; for to *embruon* is the name given



to the fetus from the time of conception to birth inclusive. The argument is from the greater to the less. If he was known to God before he had grown to certain definite shape, much less could he now elude his observation."

According to Calvin, we are human persons—known by God our Creator and objects of his remembrance—from the moment of conception. This is why Calvin, commenting on Exodus 21:22, says that "the fetus, though enclosed in the womb, is already a human being (homo), and it is almost a monstrous crime to rob it of life which it has yet begun to enjoy." He continues: "If it seems more horrible to kill a man in his own house than in a field, because a man's house is his place of most secure refuge, it ought surely to be deemed more atrocious to destroy a fetus in the womb before it has come to light."

May we be mindful to defend the precious gift of life and the priceless time of grace that the LORD has granted to accompany it.
