Not Better, But Better Off

A man was making fun of one of his friends who was a sincere Christian who believed in Jesus Christ as his Savior. "The trouble with you Christians is that you think you are better than everyone else," said the scoffer. To which the Christian replied: "Not better, but better off."

How true! Anyone who has been brought into a right relationship with God through faith in Jesus Christ is indeed better for time and eternity than the one who has no faith at all.

"Godliness is profitable unto all things," the Bible says, "having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come (1 Tim. 4:8). The godly person does not have to wait until he gets to heaven to be better off; he or she is better off right now. That reward may not be financial success or higher social standing. Perhaps no one would rate him or her at the local bank as being better off than any other of their customers. No where has the Bible told us that godliness would guarantee material success. But the Lord has told us that the rewards of humble trust in Him are peace, joy, assurance, a victorious inner life and, finally, eternal life with God in heaven.

To awaken every morning knowing that we have a Savior Who has promised to be with us always, even to the end of the world (Matt. 28:20) and to know every evening when we invite sweet sleep to erase the scars of another day, that our Savior has, through His suffering, death, and resurrection, restored us to the status of God's true children is indeed a blessing whose value can never be truly measured and a reason for giving our God our continual thanks and praise.

Our daily sins remind us that we, by nature, are no better than other people, but God's daily grace will convince us beyond all doubt that we are better off. As a result we can say with the songwriter: "How rich is my condition because God and heaven are still my own."

Everything "good" that we are or have or hope to be comes to us "from above" (James 1:17), from our Heavenly Father as a blessing in and through Christ Jesus. This removes any possibility of sinful pride and instills in each of us a genuine and sincere Christian humility that finds its only cause for glorifying "in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 1:31).

Candlelight Service:


Wed., Dec. 18 – 7:00 pm

Christmas Eve Rehearsals: This is the rehearsal schedule:


- o Sun., Dec. 8: 11:30 am-1:00 pm (hospitality after worship)

December is a busy month, but please remember the importance of these rehearsals for a successful Christmas Eve service. The last rehearsal on December 22 is the most critical as it is the dress rehearsal. It is quite helpful for the children to know their individual parts by the first rehearsal and all parts by the second rehearsal. The three "Luke 2" parts are all together as a group. Parents are encouraged <u>not</u> to have your children formally memorize Luke 2, but to simply say it with the children once or twice a day. By the time Christmas Eve comes around, they will know these well. The children have a wonderful opportunity to express the Good News of our salvation through Jesus Christ. The parents' help is greatly appreciated to make everything go well.

Christmas Worship: Our Christmas Eve service will be held on Tue., Dec. 24, 6 pm with our children presenting the Christmas Gospel. The theme this year is: "The Cross in the Christmas Tree." The kids are asked to be here ¹/₂ hour prior to the service so that we can take a group

picture and run through things. Christmas Day worship will be held Wed., Dec. 25, 10 am. May the love of this Child be the gift you open up your heart to on Christmas Day!
