For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost - Luke 19:10

Dear Preachers of the Christmas Gospel, For many in our world, Christmas is like one big desperate dive toward happiness. It's as if every year at this time a sad, lost, and lonely world tries to pull itself out of its misery, in hopes that, maybe, just maybe, this year they will find "it." But what "it" is, or how to find "it," they do not know.

Many years ago, at Wind Cave National Park, a group of young people belonging to the National Outdoor Leadership program were being trained in cave exploration. The assignment for the day was to find the leader, who had hidden himself in the cave. A girl named Rachel was searching with a team of four when she thought she heard a noise down a narrow crevice. Two of the team members waited on top while she and another member crawled down into the narrow space. When they reached the room below, the two got into an argument about how to get back to the rest of the team. Rachel took off on her own. It wasn't long before she was completely disoriented. Her training taught her to stay put and wait to be found. But, determined to find her own way back, she kept moving. Soon her flashlight went out, then her canteen went dry. Her strength slowly gave out, and though she had reached the point where she was barely able to crawl, her stubbornness would not allow her to stop and be found. Thankfully, after 34 hours of searching, she was rescued. Later, when investigators began to piece together what had happened, it was discovered that throughout most of the time she was lost, the rescue team was only minutes behind her. She was literally running away from her rescuers.

As we look upon the mad frenzy that has become Christmas, we see a world stubbornly running away from God. In his sinfulness, man is absolutely blind to the truth that only the God of the Bible can bring light and a way out from the darkness that is our sin. Our sins once threatened to condemn us all to endless despair in the fiery abyss of hell. But God sent His Son to take on our flesh and give Himself in death as a ransom for all. Through water and the Word, the Spirit has brought an end to our prideful, aimless wanderings. In God's great mercy He has made it so that, instead of running away from Him, we daily run to Him in repentant faith for the assurance of forgiveness and life everlasting. Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. He has found us! What grace is ours! Throughout this Advent and Christmas seasons, may we find renewed joy in preaching the searching and redeeming love of our Savior God. Thanks be to God for His Inscribable Gift!
