Now when the queen of Sheba heard of the fame of Solomon concerning the name of the LORD, she came to test him with hard questions.² She came to Jerusalem with a very great retinue, with camels that bore spices, very much gold, and precious stones; and when she came to Solomon, she spoke with him about all that was in her heart.³ So Solomon answered all her questions; there was nothing so difficult for the king that he could not explain *it* to her.⁴ And when the gueen of Sheba had seen all the wisdom of Solomon, the house that he had built, ⁵ the food on his table, the seating of his servants, the service of his waiters and their apparel, his cupbearers, and his entryway by which he went up to the house of the LORD, there was no more spirit in her. ⁶ Then she said to the king: "It was a true report which I heard in my own land about your words and your wisdom.⁷ "However I did not believe the words until I came and saw with my own eyes; and indeed the half was not told me. Your wisdom and prosperity exceed the fame of which I heard.⁸ "Happy are your men and happy are these your servants, who stand continually before you and hear your wisdom! "Blessed be the LORD your God, who delighted in you, setting you on the throne of Israel! Because the LORD has loved Israel forever, therefore He made you king, to do justice and righteousness." (Isaiah 60:3) The Gentiles shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising.

THE STAR SHINES THROUGH THE VEIL

Once a year on Yom Kippur the high priest would enter the Holy of Holies to offer a sacrifice and make atonement for the children of Israel (Leviticus 16). That was the only time one could enter the Holy of Holies. When the Israelites constructed the tabernacle in the wilderness, the cloud that guided them covered the tabernacle of meeting and the Lord's glory filled it (Exodus 40:34-35). It also housed the Ark of the Covenant. In Solomon's Temple, the Holy of Holies continued to house the Ark and provided it separation from the people (1 Kings 8:6-8). God's presence was near, but there was a veil.

The star that shone so bright through the first Christmas to that time that we call the Epiphany was no cloud or curtain that kept people from the Mercy Seat. It was no wall of separation between the Jews and the Gentiles like that of the Second Temple (Ephesians 2:14). The star was a sign from God. It shone brightly so that strangers and foreigners saw its light and questioned what it was. Was it what Balaam prophesied when

he said, "A Star shall come out of Jacob; a Scepter shall rise out of Israel" (Numbers 24:17)?

The star may have tipped the wise men off of something great, but they also knew from the word of God that out of Bethlehem in Judah there would "come a Ruler, who will shepherd ... Israel" (Matthew 2:6; Micah 5:2). The





May all kings fall down before him, all nations serve him!

Gentiles, including the wise men of the east, would go to His light (Isaiah 60:3). The Child in the manager, the King who they came to worship, would not have barriers between Him and the world: He would be their Mediator instead (1 Timothy 2:5).

During the season of Epiphany, we have opportunity to see what previous generations have also seen by faith: that the Christ Child was, and is, God manifested.
