## Council Meeting Notes – February 9, 2025

Meeting was opened with prayer. January Council meeting minutes were read and approved. January treasurer's report was presented and approved.

#### **Board of Elders' Report**

- The Elders are reviewing Voters' meeting attendance.

#### **Board of Education Report**

• Most schools in our area have tuition in the \$8000 range. The board has a 3year plan to raise our tuition by \$900 per year for the first student from a family. The cost of tuition should never be the only reason that a family does not enroll a child in our school. Motion approved to recommend to the Voters the following tuition amounts:

- Kevin is asking if there is a plan to get a new water fountain that includes a water bottle filler. Trustees will check on prices, but do not have a plan to replace the working water fountain.

#### Other Business

- The Sanctuary committee has selected a fabric for the pews. Motion approved to have the committee make the fabric decision. Several Council members would like the Sanctuary committee to present a cost estimate before purchasing the material.
- A member has asked to borrow tables and chairs for a graduation party this coming spring. The Trustees should respond to these requests and copy Pastor so that he is aware. Jeff will talk to the member to respond to the request. Pastor suggested that we mark the tables and chairs with our name.

### **CLC Financial Report - January 2025**

- **General Fund** We thank the Lord for moving the hearts of His people to remember the General Fund in their recent offerings. We received about \$80,000 more than we spent in January, reducing the deficit to just over \$3,000.
- **ILC Operations** Revenue is up about \$27,000 over the same period as last year while disbursements are up about \$34,000.
- **ILC Building Projects** Year-to-date contributions have been about \$230,000. The remaining year-to-date revenue of around \$108,000 is from increases in the market value of the investments in this fund.
- **Church Extension Fund** Year to date revenue consists of payments received of just over \$172,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, just under \$173,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just under \$1,000 of contributions to the fund.
- **Other Auxiliary Funds** The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
