Council Meeting Notes – March 9

Meeting opened with prayer. February Council meeting minutes were read and approved. February treasurer's report was presented and approved.

Pastor's Report:

- Instruction class: Maddie Maki, Holly Vandeveer, Deb Ness, Meagan Turner.
- Elders cancelled Bible Class & Sun. School on March 23 (Tour Choir is here).
- Pastor asked for 4 drivers to cover driving 3 ILC vans from Berea to Grace.
- April's Voter meeting will be delayed one week because of Easter.

Board of Elders' Report:

- The tour choir offering will be the loose offering on March 23 plus any designated offering. The minimum amount will be \$500 (per the handbook).
- Elders are getting ready for Easter breakfast. A signup sheet will be posted.

Board of Education Report:

- The SLP parade is June 5. Dale is coordinating participation in the parade.
- The school bought an anti-choking kit to be stored in the fellowship hall.
- The board paid for the recent field trip transportation.
- We have collected more than half of this school year's non-member tuition. This amounts to about \$19,000 for the 2023-24 school year.
- ILHS students each got \$1352.50 from the Tuition Aid Fund distribution.
- Letters have been sent to the non-member parents to inform them about the Grace tuition increase that is planned.
- The student fair will be held on April 4.

Board of Trustees' Report:

- Water fountain bottle fillers range \$200-\$800. While Trustees were not planning to get one, after discussion they will reconsider one due to the school use.
- Jeff has begun looking at selecting a new copier/printer. He has been talking to Brandon about options. A new printer might cost as much as \$5000. He also talked to staff to see what is needed. He is still investigating options.
- The Trustees are reminded that we need to audit the books.
- The concrete apron by the church entry has a crack and needs attention.

Other Business

- A committee to review the financial secretary function was appointed by the chairman. Phil presented a handout on the topic. The committee feels that someone on the council needs to be responsible for these functions. The council can appoint someone to assume the responsibility based on the constitution bylaws. Phil is willing to continue to help with these tasks, but would like a person be designated to begin to train and take over. The president is asking for a volunteer, and will plan to discuss this further at the next meeting.
- Sanctuary committee reported a quote of \$7,163 for the pews' upholstery materials. The plan is that these materials would be purchased. Volunteers will try doing the upholstery and determine if we can do that or hire professionals. The committee is recommending that the council approves the purchase of the upholstery materials so that work can begin.
- Jeff Radichel texted chairman of Berea, Nick Gamble and Dale Enns with a suggestion to do an outreach event based on a tour choir concert. Discussion.

I have been studying with a new independent Lutheran church in Burundi just over the border and the pastor their reports that their area has been flooded with refugees fleeing the war. Last month a number of embassies in Kinshasa (the capital in the west) were attacked to protest western involvement or lack of effort to end the war, including the US and French embassies. There has continued to be demonstrations and unrest around Kinshasa where Pastor Jacques Pondi Lumiangu has his church. Please pray for peace and protection in the DRC, especially in the war-torn east."

General Fund and ILC Operations – The combined balance of these two operating funds is down about \$47,000 compared to the same time one year ago. Contributions to and disbursements from the General Fund are below budget for the first eight months of our fiscal year. For ILC Operations, the revenue is ahead of budget with disbursements less than the pro-rated budget.

ILC Building Projects – Year-to-date contributions have been about \$235,000. The remaining year-to-date revenue of around \$143,000 is from increases in the market value of the investments in this fund.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of payments received of just over \$229,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, just under \$230,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just under \$1,000 of contributions to the fund.

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
