Sermon: Acts 14:8-18

⁸ And in Lystra a certain man without strength in his feet was sitting, a cripple from his mother's womb, who had never walked. ⁹ This man heard Paul speaking. Paul, observing him intently and seeing that he had faith to be healed, ¹⁰ said with a loud voice, "Stand up straight on your feet!" And he leaped and walked. ¹¹ Now when the people saw what Paul had done, they raised their voices, saying in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!" ¹² And Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul, Hermes, because he was the chief speaker.¹³ Then the priest of Zeus, whose temple was in front of their city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates, intending to sacrifice with the multitudes. ¹⁴ But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard this, they tore their clothes and ran in among the multitude, crying out ¹⁵ and saying, "Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men with the same nature as you, and preach to you that you should turn from these useless things to the living God, who made the heaven, the earth, the sea, and all things that are in them, ¹⁶ "who in bygone generations allowed all nations to walk in their own ways. ¹⁷ "Nevertheless He did not leave Himself without witness, in that He did good, gave us rain from heaven and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness." ¹⁸ And with these sayings they could scarcely restrain the multitudes from sacrificing to them. $(NKJV^{TM})$

- **General Fund** You will notice that we are continuing to run a year-to-date deficit in our General Fund. We have not met our budget for the past several years and while we have been blessed to have a reserve fund that has covered our shortfall, we cannot continue to deficit spend. With only about a month remaining in our fiscal year ending with June, it will be beneficial for each of us to prayerfully consider what we can do to support the General Fund. May our Gracious Lord bless our humble efforts.
- **ILC Operations** While ILC Operations is subsidized by the General Fund and currently has a balance of about \$120,000, based on past history, that balance will likely be eliminated by the end of the year since there is very little revenue in the month of June. Last year, for example, June had a deficit of \$124,000.
- **ILC Building Projects** Year-to-date contributions have been about \$260,000. The remaining year-to-date revenue of around \$80,000 is from increases in the market value of the investments in this fund.
- **Church Extension Fund** Year to date revenue consists of payments received of about \$246,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, just over \$135,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just over \$1,000 of contributions to the fund.
- **Other Auxiliary Funds** The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.

ASCENSION AND GRADUATION

"Pomp and Circumstance" sounds in the back-ground as graduates in robes and mortar boards march across the stage to shake the hand of the Dean or Principal and accept their diplomas. Graduation day is filled with both the joy of completing studies and the sadness of friendships and things familiar coming to an end. There are tears as friends made at school won't be seeing each other on a daily basis, as they head off to different colleges or on to their lives in the workforce. At the time, High School graduation seems like a very big deal indeed, but as time goes by and you get older you realize that it was just the very beginning of learning and living. Leaving the college campus too is possibly the end of

your classroom instruction for the rest of your life, but in reality is the beginning of your instruction in life itself.

On Ascension Day, the Lord Jesus left this earth as He rose up into the air, only to be covered by a cloud. There was no band playing. There were no hats thrown up into the air in celebration. There were only a handful of men, gazing up into the sky as a man visibly, quietly left the earth.
