(Sarah was listening in the tent door which was behind him.) ¹¹ Now Abraham and Sarah were old, well advanced in age; and Sarah had passed the age of childbearing. 12 Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, "After I have grown old, shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?" ¹³ And the LORD said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh, saying, 'Shall I surely bear *a child*, since I am old?' ¹⁴ "Is anything too hard for the LORD? At the appointed time I will return to you, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son." ¹⁵ But Sarah denied it, saying, "I did not laugh," for she was afraid. With June bringing an end to our fiscal year, we are able to look back and see how we ended up financially. In the table above, under Operating Funds, you will see the revenue and disbursements for the **General Fund** and for **ILC Operations**. Comparing them to the budget for the year, contributions to the **General Fund** were \$179,347 less than the amount budgeted, and disbursements were \$89,830 less than budget, resulting in a shortfall of \$89,517. Although **ILC Operations** ended the year with \$35,264 less in revenue than was planned, disbursements were \$66,946 less than budget, resulting in a positive balance for the year of \$31,682. Because the **General Fund** subsidizes **ILC Operations**, the balance that is left in **ILC Operations** is closed out to the **General Fund**. Netting the two still leaves the **General Fund** with a deficit of \$57,835 for the year. Consequently, that amount is pulled from the **Reserve Fund** in order to bring the balance in the **General Fund** up to zero at June 30. This leaves a balance of \$103,629 in the **Reserve Fund** to carry forward to future years.

For the new fiscal year beginning in July 2025, the **General Fund** budget was reduced almost \$50,000 to \$1,265,097. This was possible due to a couple of things, including an anticipated increase in ILC student enrollment and revenue, resulting in a decrease in the amount of subsidy needed, and a decrease in the budget for funding the EduK8 Fund based on the actual expected needs for the fiscal year. The new budget did provide for modest salary increases for called workers and staff and was also increased to fund an increased portion of the costs of the third missionary. Although there is a reduction in the budget, the new budget is still an increase of 11.6% over the amount of contributions received last year.

For the **Auxiliary Funds** you can look at the numbers above to see how each of them fared. The revenue in the **Auxiliary Funds** included over \$400,000 that came by way of market gains for the year on the investments in **ILC Building Projects** and the **Church Extension Fund**.

We are thankful to have had the **Reserve Fund** available to cover the deficits the past several years. With the 11.6% increase in needed contributions for the new year, your prayers, consideration, and contributions will be needed once again.

Meeting opened with prayer. A motion approved to welcome Clifford Kuehne into voting membership. A motion approved to welcome Steve Kuehne into voting membership. April voters' meeting minutes were read and approved. Second quarter Treasurer's Report was presented and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Pre-marital counseling: Jessica Maki and Daniel Robin (Oct. 18 wedding)
- Annette & Stephen Kuehne transfer from Berea Inver Grove Hts., MN, has been received.
- Clifford Kuehne transfer from Berea Inver Grove Hts., MN, has been received.
- Ben Crandall transferred to heavenly glory on 6/17/2025 (memorial 7/26/2025)
- Motion approved from Council recommendation that we ratify Lilly Nelson and Zara Wales into communicant membership (confirmed on May 18).
- No Board of Elders' report.

Board of Education Report

- Motion approved to call Eli Wales as the 2025-26 Sunday School superintendent.
- The school staff and board would like the school carpets cleaned before Aug. 2.
- The school would like to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the school on September 13, 2026. The alumni and past teachers will be invited. There will be a potluck lunch after the service. There will be a history book about the school.

Board of Trustees' Report

- One vacuum cleaner has been replaced.
- Jeff and possibly Pastor will meet with a printer sales person to get a demo of a printer.
- Jeff is trying to find a drinking fountain on sale before school starts.
- Dan is working to get swing set installed before school starts.

Financial Secretary Committee Report

- Phil reported that Dale is set up on all the financial systems and is beginning to perform the financial secretary tasks.
- We have combined the two reserve accounts into a single reserve account in the treasurer's report.
- The financial secretary has moved \$5000 from the checking account to the reserve account per Council direction. The Council will review the balance in the checking account on a monthly basis and transfer funds as needed.
- MN paid leave law is coming in 2026. We cannot opt out of participation in that benefit program. We will be billed based on our employee count. Phil has set up our account on this state run system. Our payroll system had notified us that they couldn't pay the taxes until we were set on that system. We will get more information from the state over the next few months. The first quarterly payment will be in April 2026. We don't know how much this payment will be.

Sanctuary Improvement Committee Report

- Re-upholstery of the pews is complete. The estimate was \$18,000 plus the cost of padding. The actual cost was about \$8,000. It took about 7 hours per pew plus cleanup and shopping. Thanks to everyone that helped.
- Feedback received is that the colors in the sanctuary are cold. The committee intends to make the primary focus of the sanctuary be the altar area of the room.
- In the July 27, 2024, Voters meeting a motion asked the sanctuary committee to
 develop a completely new option for the altar area. The committee has been
 asked to give the sanctuary a consistent appearance. Some have said that the
 current altar is not consistent with the rest of the sanctuary. In response the
 committee has combined elements of the stained-glass, the straight lines of the
 building, and the current altar.
- The altar concept was projected followed by discussion.
- Motion approved that the committee develop this concept more fully and get feedback from the congregation.

Other Business

- Bill Rust gave a report on the Minnesota delegate conference. Bill has the materials provided at the conference. The materials are available.
 - There was a communion service.
 - A paper written by James Arndt was presented. It dealt with the balance of secular and divine authority and Christian influence on the US Constitution.
 - The Minnesota Paid Leave Law was presented.
 - The CLC Board of Educations and Publications explained how the EDUK8 fund is used.
 - There was a report on the ILC Facility Expansion Project.
 - Pastor Mayhew gave a presentation on identifying and avoiding reformed theology.
 - There was an election of delegate conference officers.
 - No congregations volunteered to host the joint Reformation service.
 - The pastors were asked to see if any congregation might offer to host a joint mission service.
- Benno reported that in June there were 8 contributions that used online giving.
 Benno will be ordering more envelopes. There is a request to add an additional CLC fund on the envelopes.
- Eli reported that there were no contacts resulting from the SLP Tower Days
 Parade. He wonders if the effort might be better used in other activities. The
 board of education will consider future involvement in the parade. Rick thinks
 that there are other benefits from participation in the parade beyond just
 generating following contacts.
