Forget Everything!

Forget everything you thought you knew! Sometimes circumstances are so different and unexpected that you need to totally forget old assumptions and gain a new perspective. The day may come when cars with internal combustion engines will be a relic of the past. If you are accustomed to filling the gas tank, changing the oil, and hearing the sounds of revving engines, you will need to forget all that and learn the new reality of batteries, charging stations, and silent operation.



Life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.

"Forget everything you think you know" is what God tells us. With our sinful nature we think we know what life is about, where we stand with God, and what is important for our ultimate wellbeing. We think this present life is what matters most. We see ourselves as basically good people. We imagine God will be pleased if we try to keep the Commandments, and that happiness and success are linked to our achievements and the recognition of others.

"Forget all that," the Lord tells us. "A man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions" (Luke 12:15). Our status with God does not depend on our own goodness. "All our righteous acts are like filthy rags" (Isaiah 64:6). We have no accomplishments



deserving God's reward. We can't trust our own reason. "The heart is deceitful above all things" (Jeremiah 17:9).

"Forget all that." In His Word the Spirit opens our eyes and understanding to

what is truly real. We come to see the harsh reality of our sin and its condemnation. Yet the Lord is quick to assure us of His love and that "where sin abounded grace did much more abound" (Romans 5:20). Lasting happiness and success are not dependent on today's weather or how our plans turn out. We are blessed eternally with forgiveness earned by Jesus on



the cross. Meaningful purpose is not found in what others do for us, but in putting Christ's love into practice in serving others. Forgetting self in love for Jesus, let's look today for those opportunities to serve the Lord and our neighbor.

- There was no Elders' report.

Board of Education Report

- A new student has enrolled for the 2025-26 school year. Projected enrollment is 5 in kindergarten, 10 in grades 1-4, and 8 in grades 5-8.
- Tuition of about \$39,900 is expected in the coming school year.
- Some non-member parents have expressed concern that the tuition is increasing by \$900. The main concern they expressed is that the tuition not continue to go up at the same rate. Money is being donated by 3rd parties to help with the tuition for two families. Discussion about cost of non-member tuition. Is it too high? What's its purpose? We are close to being able to support the cost side of our 3 schoolrooms. God gives the money and the children. The tuition is part of our stewardship of God's gifts. The school is meant to help provide Christian education for the children of our congregation, and as we are, able to provide that education to children in our community. The Board of Education will write up a response to some of the questions which were raised.

Board of Trustees' Report

- A printer from Loffler has been purchased. It will be installed in about 3 weeks.
- Jeff is planning to buy the water fountain.
- Planning is being done to fix cracks in the parking lot.
- There is a snowblower in the parsonage garage. Jeff will check into that.

Other Business

- Eli reported that Jan would like the choir director platform saved and carpeted.
- Motion approved to move \$10,000 from the checking account to the Fidelity Reserves Account.
- Brian will reimburse Daniel for preaching today.
- Dale reported that Pat Paplow got an email from the electronic lock company asking if the list door lock system administrators should be updated. The current list of administrators is Pat Paplow, Brandon Paplow, and Bill Rust.
- Motion approved to have a Trustee be added as an administrator of the electronic door lock system.

The Coordinating Council passed a **General Fund** budget for our contributions of \$1,265,097 for the new year or about \$105,425 per month. Although this is a decrease from the prior year budget, it is still an increase of 11.6% over what was received in contributions last year.

You can look at the detail above to see how each of the **Operating** and **Auxiliary** Funds fared in July. With the substantial increase in the need for contributions over last year to do the work set before us, your prayers, consideration, and contributions are needed for the new year.
