- C.F.W. Walther on Death -

Death is the most powerful and effective preacher the children of this world have. Though they avoid all churches and despise all preachers of God's Word, yet one preacher - death - they are compelled to hear. His church is the earth, his pulpit the death-bed, the casket, the hearse, the grave, and the cemetery. With a heartrending voice he cries out, "O man, it is appointed unto you to die; you have no continuing city in this world, this earth is not your home, this life does not finish your course; in an hour unknown to you you will have to leave this world with all its treasures. Oh, repent, repent!"

- Martin Luther on Hell -

Hell naturally makes the deeper impression: It is natural that the wide-open mouth of hell causes us more terror than the open heaven brings us joy, just as one reflection on sin brings on more sadness than almost all the sermons about the merit of Christ afford us joy.

Hell - Now and Later: I am as yet not too sure what hell really is like before the Last Day. For I think nothing of the picture of the artists and the preaching of belly servers [false teachers], according to what it is supposed to be a particular place in which the damned souls now exist. After all, the devils themselves are not yet in hell but, as Peter says (2 Peter 2:4), are reserved for hell in bounds; and St. Paul calls them the rulers and the mighty ones of this world who move about in the upper air (Eph. 6:2). Moreover, Christ calls the devil the prince of this world (John 12:31). But this could certainly not be true if the devils were in hell ... To be sure, however, matters will take a different turn on the Last Day. Then hell will be a particular place, where those will be who are condemned to hell or to the eternal wrath of God. ... No doubt it now is, and will be, far worse than anything one is able to describe, picture, or think it to be.

- Martin Luther on Heaven -

Living and Longing for Heaven: We should learn to bring our eyes, our hearts, and souls to bear upon yonder life in heaven and in a lively hope await it with joy. For if we would be Christians, the ultimate objects of our quest should not be marrying, giving in marriage, buying, selling, planting, building — activities that Christ says (Matt. 24:37 ff.; Luke 17:26 ff.) the wicked will be engaged in especially before the Last Day. To be sure, we, too, must use these things in order to satisfy the needs of the body. But our ultimate quest should be something better and higher: the blessed inheritance in heaven that does not pass away.


